To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

The month of November is full of holidays: Thanksgiving, Veteran's Day, Election Day, Martin Luther's Birthday, but the most important holiday is the first one -- All Saints' Day. As Lutherans, each year we celebrate Reformation Day on All Saints' Eve. This year, our Reformation Festival is actually on Sunday, October 31. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther, a professor at the University of Wittenburg, nailed to the Wittenburg church door 95 proposals for debate (The 95 Theses) because he questioned the church's practice of selling indulgences, which were pieces of paper claiming to offer the owner of that paper complete forgiveness for their sins.

However, in our celebration of the Reformation of the Church, we often overlook why Martin Luther chose October 31 as the day to post his proposals for debate. He knew that on October 31, all of the students and professors from the university would be in church. October 31 is a major Christian holiday. It is the Eve of All Saints' Day.

On All Saints' Eve and All Saints' Day, the people of God would gather together and honor the memory of those who had died in the faith. It was a major festival in the life of the church. Rather than fearing the pagan superstitions of ghosts and goblins, they chose to commune with the "angels, archangels, and all the company of heaven." (Although there were many Christians in the 16th Century who also were very superstitious.)

In recent gatherings of our Junior and Senior High School students, there were discussions as to what is proper for Christians to do on or around Halloween (All Hallows' Eve). As I like to say, I do not have anything against trick or treat activity, except for the "tricks." The LCMS has no official position, but parents are encouraged to use common sense in choosing costumes or activities for the children.

Also, with all the noise of the secular Halloween festivities, the joy of remembering the hallowed or holy ones with the Lord on October 31 and November 1 is often lost or forgotten. All Hallows' Eve and All Saints' Day are meant to be celebrations remembering the dead in Christ. They have finished their course in faith and we remember them in light of what Christ has done for them in His death and resurrection.

This does not mean that children can't dress up, knock on doors, and consume mass quantities of chocolate. But remind yourself and your children of the real meaning of All Hallows' Eve and All Saints' Day. Of all the holidays of November, and even more than the celebration of the Reformation, these are holidays (holy days) worthy of special attention.

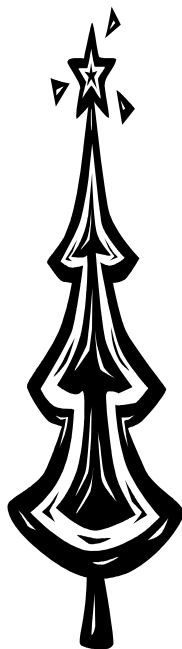

Tour the Luther Sites!

There is still room for a few more to join Dave Rohe and President Bueltmann on a nine day, tour of the Luther sites, and especially the quaint "Home" of the Reformation, Wittenberg Germany. We will tentatively leave Bloomington, Illinois on Tuesday, arriving in Frankfurt Germany on Wednesday morning.

We will then spend the next eight days visiting the sites where Luther taught, preached, and was instrumental in the reformation of the church. We will see places like Worms, Leipzig, Eisenach, Eisleben, Berlin, Rothenburg, Mansfeld, Schmalkalden, Grimma and especially, Wittenberg. We will tour the Wartburg Castle, Luther's Birth and Death houses, the Luther museum, and the church where Paul Gerhardt served. We will visit the church where J S Bach served as well.

This trip is scheduled for May 10-18, 2011. We may even add an additional day. The itinerary above is tentative, but the locations of the sites we want to see are basically those listed. There will be room for 25-30 individuals and hotel accommodations will be based on double occupancy.
