To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

As we draw to the close of this school year, I have been blessed with added insight to the value of St. James Lutheran School. As you know, I was asked to teach the sixth grade religion class each morning this trimester. When Mr. Landskroener first asked me if I had the time to do this, I answered and said, "No, I don't have the time. But I will do it anyway." I wasn't sure how this was going to work, especially with Lent and Holy Week. However, it has been a great experience. It is like teaching confirmation class, except we can carry on conversations from day to day rather than week to week.

The opportunity for me to teach was something I couldn't pass up, and I have been blessed to be an active part of the daily life of the school. However, the best part is that I have been reminded of the tremendous opportunity the children have. We begin each day with the Word of God. Wednesday is chapel. The other four days, the day starts with religion class. Each morning, I am reminded of these words from Deuteronomy 6:6-7: "These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

When the children of Israel in particular (and the people of God throughout the generations) failed to teach the next generation the Word of God – or taught it in such a way that it was not taken seriously, an unfaithful generation would rise up, forget about God, and plunge into social and spiritual chaos. What I just described is certainly the history of God's people as Scripture tells in the books of Judges, Kings, and Chronicles.

We often like to think of the people in those days acting as one monolithic mass falling away from God and His Word. The reality is that it was many individuals (fathers in particular) neglecting their duty to teach, train, and lead by example. God's Word clearly speaks to individuals and says, "These commandments that I give **you** today are to be upon **your** hearts. Impress them on **your** children. Talk about them when **you** sit at home and when **you** walk along the road, when **you** lie down and when **you** get up."

We love to sit with a cup of coffee (or Diet Coke), chat with our friends, and solve all of our society's problems. We tend to have all the answers when we view the people of our day as one monolithic mass rather than as individuals. The reality is that society changes one person at a time. The church grows one person at a time. **Your** children will not know the Word of God unless **your** children grow up hearing the Word of God.

The primary place we hear the Word is in worship. We hear it in the lessons, in the liturgy, in the hymns, and in the sermon (I pray). In support of what happens in worship, there is Sunday School and Bible Class. However, if the other six days of the week are neglected, that is a long time in darkness without the light of the Gospel. Which is why having the youth begin their day with the Word of God is such valuable training. So much of our day is filled with learning unimportant things. So many of our youth spend their time filling their eyes and ears with the things that will lead them to destruction. Jesus says, "The eye is the lamp to the body ... If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!" [Mt. 6:22-23].

We are blessed to have the opportunity for our children to begin each day with the light of the Gospel. I encourage each of you to begin and end your day with important things. You may feel that you do not have the time for devotion. Do it anyway. You will not regret it.


