To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Over the weekend of July 23-24, three people told me that they were going to be joining Our Redeemer. They each had moved to town, or were in the process of moving, and desired to become a part of our fellowship. One other person, a friend of a current member, came as a visitor and indicated we might be seeing more of her. It brought me great joy. My sinful nature wanted me to spend some time patting myself on the back, but fortunately I quickly realized that all four of these people have relationships with existing members of our church.

In my experience, it is through relationships with the children of God that the Word of God becomes more easily heard. The spouse of one of our members recently told me that she enjoys coming to Our Redeemer because our church is friendly. This also brought me great joy.

July 23 was the day of Ruth Sprenger's funeral. One of our long time members told me that when she visited Our Redeemer for the first time, Ruth saw her, introduced herself, and made her feel welcome. Decades later, this was still remembered. Do not ever underestimate the value of a kind word or the greeting of a stranger. This is part of the work of the Holy Spirit in you.

Certainly, "by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" [Eph. 2:8-9]. It is solely through the Word of God and the light of Christ filling the darkness of a sinful heart that creates faith. However, the Holy Spirit's work does not end at Baptism nor is it complete simply in your coming to worship. Paul continues: "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them" [Eph. 2:10]. The good that you do; the kindness you show; these are deeds God prepared beforehand for you to accomplish.

I encourage you to invite those with whom you have relationships to come and hear the Word of God. And while you are here, get to know your brothers and sisters in Christ. Make the effort. When you make a stranger feel welcome, they are no longer a stranger. That good work may be remembered for decades by that one-time stranger who is now a friend. It will certainly be remembered by our Father in heaven. Jesus says, "Whoever receives you receives Me, and whoever receives Me receives Him who sent Me . . . And whoever gives one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is My disciple, truly, I say to you, he will by no means lose his reward" [Mt. 10:40, 42].
