To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

It is amazing how it seems all of life's schedule of activities revolves around the school year. I prefer to place a positive spin on this phenomenon and attribute it to our devotion to our children and grandchildren, and to the importance of education in their lives and in ours.

Even our secular culture understands the importance of education. If a person has never been taught to use words or numbers, they will not get very far in life. Yet, functioning in the Kingdom of God without knowledge of God and His Word is like functioning in society without knowledge of words or numbers.

Failing to instruct and expose our youth concerning God will have eternal consequences. We need to place requirements on our children (and on ourselves) to learn and study and grow in regard to the things of God. Scripture commands us to be ever prepared to meet our Lord – which is the ultimate final exam.

Beyond our support for St. James School, at Our Redeemer, there are numerous educational opportunities for all ages. The primary place of learning of the mercy, grace, and love of God is participation in the worship of our Lord in the Divine Service. All are encouraged to also participate in Christian education in Sunday School and Adult Bible Class. Please make the effort to bring yourselves and your children. Just like with secular education, parents and teachers need to place requirements on children (even if the children do not like the requirements) because it is ultimately in the child's best interest.

I am very excited about this upcoming academic year. Our Redeemer has 25 students at St. James School K-8 and eight Preschool students. We had 30 participants at our first PLuS group activity. Confirmation begins Wednesday, September 7, as will our 1:00 Bible Study. Our Thursday noon study of the biblical sites in Israel has heightened the anticipation of our journey there this Fall.

Please join in the many opportunities to learn more about God and what He has done for you. Education is a lifelong endeavor. Gaining knowledge of God goes on for eternity.

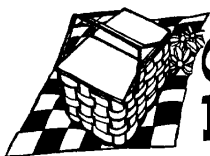
