However, as has been stated at meetings of the Council, Elders, and Long Range Planning Committee in recent times, the goal of balancing the budget is not so that we can rest comfortably on a balanced budget. As was said many times, it would be foolish and irresponsible to introduce an expanded plan when we can't pay the current bills.

It is exciting that we may be able to start talking about some new opportunities. Our Long Range Planning Committee has met a few times, and as was reported at the August meetings, we are working to establish short, medium, and long range goals. One of the short range goals that we have already implemented is having special music each weekend. On the Sundays when the choir does not sing, we have already had several of the many talented singers in our church offer their services. Without me asking, when their schedule allows, they have made the effort to sing on Saturday evening as well as the two Sunday morning services. Truly, the generous spirit of the people of God manifests itself in many different ways.

I am very optimistic about the current and future mission and ministry happening at Our Redeemer. Likewise, I am very thankful for the previous 71 years of mission and ministry. As the people of God, we get to build on the firm foundation of Jesus Christ, His Word, and the Sacraments. The generous spirit of the people of God at Our Redeemer has been around since the Durst's Dairy days. I have been told that those were exciting times filled with hope and optimism about the future mission and ministry of the church. With that same spirit, I pray we move forward as stewards of the gifts of God.
