To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

This month, Annalisa becomes a teenager. I have to ask myself, "Where did that time go?" It is a cliche, but it truly seems like only yesterday that Malinda and I were attending pregnancy classes, visiting the doctor every few weeks, and seeing my little girl's image on the ultrasound. What has stuck with me even 13 years after those experiences is the memory of seeing that ultrasound for the first time.

To be honest, I was not all that thrilled with Malinda's doctor basically requiring an ultrasound. We weren't going to have one. And having looked at ultrasound pictures of other people's kids in the past, they only looked like little blobs of light against a dark background. But when I was able to actually see the ultrasound performed, I saw our child moving its arms and kicking its legs. The baby was less than two inches long, but the nurse was able to show me all five fingers on the baby's right hand. The head was very distinct, the body was formed, and the constant movement in the upper chest was the heart visibly and rapidly beating.

My hesitation for the ultrasound procedure was replaced by the joy of seeing my child – and seeing that there was only one in there. I have a cousin with triplet girls and a set of twins. The joy of seeing arms and legs move when the nurse pressed down was unspeakable. However, the one other thought that passed through my mind was also unspeakable. Malinda was still in her first trimester. The vast majority of abortions are performed at about that time in the pregnancy.

On that day, months before she was born, I saw my child. God had created a most wonderful life. Mankind has chosen to kill millions of children who had arms and legs and heads and hearts. This didn't begin in the 1970's. In the year 210 A. D., Minucius Felix, one of the great fathers of the Christian Church, condemned abortions in a letter to the Roman Emperor Octavius, Minucius wrote, "There are some women who, by drinking medical preparations, extinguish the source of the future man in their very bowels, and thus commit a parricide before they bring forth. . . To us it is not lawful either to see or hear of homicide" [Ante-Nicene Fathers iv., p. 192].

This sin has been around for a long time. As Solomon says, "There is nothing new under the sun" [Eccl. 1:9]. Different legislation may change the public nature of how lives are terminated, but really only the Gospel can change the hearts of the people of this world.

All life is precious and is to be cherished. Whether it is a child in the womb or an elderly person whose healthier days are long since gone, all life is precious because all life is a gift from God. In our society today, we see the words of the Psalmist fulfilled, "On every side the wicked prowl, as vileness is exalted among the children of men" [Ps. 12:8]. However, in Scripture, we also see the extent of God's love for us. To the prophet Jeremiah, the Lord said, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart" [Jer. 1:5]. And the Psalmist said, "Your eyes saw my unformed body. All the days ordained for me were written in Your book before one of them came to be" [Ps. 139:16]. Give thanks to God for the gift of life.



Dr. Robert Weise from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis be the guest presenter.

Dr. Weise's presentation sets forth how all ages of Christians living in this 21st Century biotech world can continue to live a fruitful life of service and witness even when marriage is being devalued (redefined) along with human life and aging. Those areas of biotechnology that continue to influence Christian life are assisted reproductive technology, sex selection, pre-implantation genetic diagnosis (destroying fertilized human embryos that are determined to be carrying a disease), ageism (discriminating against the older adult), test-tube reproduction in same-sex unions, and how the artificial institute of intelligence and NASA are working together to create the first 'transhuman' (more computer than human) in the quest of human immortality. The presentation of these biotech advances and more, will be discussed in light of the Biblical Creation as baptized Christians, both young and old. In addition, this presentation will incorporate the impact on political correctness on the use and abuse of biotechnology. In spite of the seemingly broad content of this presentation, there will be time for questions and discussions.

As confusing as the terms might seem in this description, these topics and procedures are on the cutting-edge of human life as we know it, and their implications are diverse. We would all, benefit by learning about them and how they fit into God's creation. Please join us for Dr. Weise's presentation on a topic that hits all of us close to the heart: human life.

Pastor Bender "Forgiveness: The Heart of the Gospel"

Luther stated in his Small Catechism regarding the Sacrament of the Altar, "For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation." Sin permeates the world in which we live. We also sin much daily and deserve nothing but God's punishment, as Luther stated elsewhere in his catechetical work. Without the forgiveness of sins, we would be lost forever. As God's children, we are also called to share this forgiveness with others, with the warning from Jesus that if we withhold forgiveness from others God, His Father, will withhold it from us. In this session we will take a look at several passages from Scripture on forgiveness, which is the heart of the Gospel.

The Dating of the Exodus: Archaeological Evidence from Egypt and Israel

The Exodus of the Israelite people from their temporary dwelling place of Egypt is the defining event in the Old Testament history of the children of Abraham. In this event, the children of Jacob witnessed the mighty, saving work of Yahweh, and they became a nation. Unfortunately, in the modern era, most of the discussion concerning the Exodus has turned from the saving work of God in this event.

In the past century, the discussion among theologians has turned to become a debate over the actual date of the event. There are even those who deny that the Exodus event even happened.

Establishing an historical date for the Exodus is important. The work that theologians and archaeologists have done has put the Biblical text into an historical context. The physical proof that has been uncovered by archaeologists in the twentieth century has done much to solidify the claims of Scripture.
