To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

With the dawn of modern medicine and the relative peace and prosperity of our age, our lives are ones of ease and comfort – from the world's standard. I know that our nation is currently at war. Lives are filled with tragedy, loss, abuse, cancer, and other ravages of sin which hit far too close to home. The stock market has seen better days. Yet, none of you worry about soldiers forcing you from your homes, sending you to refugee camps, or circumstances which lead to your starving out in the cold.

Diseases which once meant certain death are now sometimes even easily treated. Polio, measles, mumps, plague, and small pox have not threatened us for many years. Through most of time, mother's dying in childbirth or the dreaded ruptured appendix touched most every family. Since the Fall into sin, most generations have lived in a world in which disease and destruction were all too common. The early Church arose at a time when life expectancy was in the 30's and anyone over 60 was considered truly old. In the days of the apostles, over one-third of all people were slaves and in some areas it was as high as 60%.

In our nation, gone are the days when one bad crop meant the poor risked starvation or the threat of slavery. Our fear seems to be that we will eat too much. As many of you know, I am currently in a contest with Pastor Bender because we both are trying to lose 20 pounds. Advertisements for weight loss products fill the airwaves.

When I talk to the youth of our church – and even with many adults – their greatest fear is boredom – a sense of nothing to do. Fear that someone somewhere is having more fun than me and I am being left out.

Some of you are probably thinking, "I wish that I had time on my hands." You do have time on your hands. Every 24 hours of a given day, you choose to fill that time in some way.

Working long hours, playing sports, going to a movie, or watching "Biggest Loser" are not sinful activities in and of themselves. However, there was a time when reading Scripture and the Catechism in the home was a common daily activity among Christian families.

The modern complaint is that there is no extra time in the day. However, before modern technological advancement heated our homes, washed and dried our clothes, transported us to work, and preserved our food, families seemed to find the time for God's Word.

We tend to avoid what we fear. If boredom is the fear of modern man, then modern man's greatest desire would be to find the time for every form of entertainment or activity and then schedule our lives around those seemingly endless events.

We see this kind of scheduling in the lives of people of all ages. Schedule some time for the Lord and you will understand what Jesus meant when He said, "Come to Me, all you who are wearied and burdened, and I will give you rest.
