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To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Our beloved church has so many events, activities, and celebrations happening that there is danger of truly important events being overlooked. The Spring Fling was a big success. Confirmation questioning was a great opportunity to see our youth bear witness of their faith. The new member dinner was very well attended and was a fun opportunity to meet our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Holy Week is rapidly approaching. Palm Sunday and Confirmation are almost here. The sweet joy of Easter is so close we can almost taste it. Each of these events are certainly worthy of our attention, but the greatest celebration God has provided happens each Sunday as we gather at the Lord's Table to receive Christ's body and blood.

Without this promise, there would be nothing to celebrate on Easter, there would be no reason to confirm the faith of our Baptism, and this congregation would be gathering in futility. Our Redeemer Lutheran Church is a sacramental community. We are a people of Word and Sacrament. We are recognized as Christ's Church because the Word is proclaimed and the Sacraments are administered. Nothing else that goes on in this community would be of any consequence if these Means of Grace were neglected.

So rejoice in the forgiveness, life, and salvation promised in Christ. Sing "Hosanna" on Palm Sunday and "Alleluia" on Easter. And please don't ever neglect the broken body and shed blood of Christ. Our Lord Himself compels us in saying, "Do this in remembrance of Me."

St. James Lutheran School News

NEW COMPUTER LAB – St. James Lutheran School has recently been blessed with funds to upgrade our entire computer lab! Thanks to a combination of fundraisers, Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, the Friends of St. James, the alumni, our PTL, and some budgeted funds, the school was able to purchase equipment and software to create 22 totally new and up to date computer work stations in our lab in the basement. The new computer lab is expected to be up and running when the students return from Easter break.

The new system is known as a "Thin Client" system. It consists of a server or "host computer", 22 thin clients, each with a keyboard and a mouse, and a 20" flat panel monitor. Work stations will function the same as if a high speed computer is at each station. However, in place of a computer, a station will now have a small box to connect the keyboard, mouse, monitor, network cable, and headphones. This small box is the thin client. It also has USB ports for connecting flash memory drives to store data.

Each of the 22 thin clients connect via network cable to the host computer. The host computer is loaded with the most current operating system, and the newest versions of Microsoft Office and other software. It supplies each work station with the operating system and any other software the students are using in the lab. It will also provide a connection to the Internet. (Our Internet runs thru filters and firewalls to prevent students from accidentally accessing inappropriate materials.)

In the past few years, the St. James School Technology Committee has overseen the replacement of computers and printers for all teachers and office staff, the installation of Smart Boards in every classroom (PreK-4 thru 8th grade), and now a completely new computer lab. St. James is truly blessed with individuals and groups who generously help our School keep up with ever changing technology needs. Future plans are to obtain additional thin clients or new computers, so that each classroom has at least one or two student work stations. In addition, the Committee is also studying the feasibility of students using electronic tablets in some classrooms.

ENROLLMENT HAS BEGUN! – We are currently enrolling students in PreK 3 – 8th grade for the 2012-2013 school year! Enrollment applications are available in the school office or one can be mailed to you.

You may ask "What can I do to help promote St. James Lutheran School?" Pray! Pray! pray! We pray that the Quincy community will see our school as an important tool to develop students' faith in Jesus along with offering the best academic education in a safe, loving Christian environment. Encourage your friends and neighbors to consider St. James for the Christian education of their child, where Seeing and Sharing Jesus happens every day. 2012 Scholarship Endowment Sunday May 6, 2012 ''Will They Always Be there?''

The 2011-2012 academic school year is about to end and once again our sights are set on next fall when our students will begin yet another year at our ten Concordia Universities and our two seminaries. Once again they must be thinking about how they will pay for another year of school. Once again, they will have to consider how large their academic debt will be when they graduate from school and begin their careers as pastor, teacher, DCE, or Deaconess.

The Central Illinois District(CID) Endowment Fund is a large source of funds to assist these students. In fact, the CID is one of the top districts in synod when it comes to supporting our students. But even with all that we do, it is not enough. Many of our new pastors and teachers are graduating with debt loads at near or above six figures.

I realize that many congregations have scholarship funds that they use to support students from their congregation. We are not here to compete with those funds. Our aim is to supplement them and assist our students to the best of our ability.

The District Endowment Fund now stands at \$852,054 principal. Each year we use the earnings of that account only for Scholarships and grants to students from the CID. In a good year, we can earn 5% on that principal, or about \$42,500. And that is not enough to meet the need. Our aim is to raise the principal of the fund to \$2-3 Million so we can double or triple the amount we have available to grant.

This is where we need your help. The Board of Directors of the CID Foundation has named Sunday May 6, 2012 as Scholarship Endowment Sunday. Most congregations in the CID will indicate this in their Sunday bulletin. The Foundation Board has asked the district pastors to have a door offering on that day and forward the proceeds to the District. It is up to each pastor to either participate or not. Should an individual prefer to make a more significant gift, pastor will have special envelopes available for individual use. Ask him for one.

The Sunday we have chosen does not necessarily work for all congregations for various reasons. In those instances, we have allowed the pastor to choose a more acceptable Sunday for his congregation. Either way, we pray that all 156 congregations in the Central Illinois District will consider their participation and be generous. We know we cannot build this principal amount in one year, but steady growth over a few years will get the job done.
