

To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I have gotten a good deal of positive feedback concerning our change to our Summer schedule. From June 10 until August 26, there will be no Sunday School or Adult Bible class prior to worship on Sunday mornings. Also the Divine Service will be begin at 9:00 AM rather than the regular 8:00 & 10:15 AM starting time. The 5:00 PM Saturday Service will remain the same. Many churches have this type of Summer scheduling change. One of the benefits will be the blending together of our "early" and "late" members who have worshiped at the same altar for years but possibly have never met.

There were a few who questioned the wisdom of not having Sunday School during the Summer. The reality is that the Sunday School opening room and classrooms will be under construction through most of those 11 weeks, so having class would be a mighty challenge. But my experience with a break in the Summer is that it gives the Sunday School teachers a time to refresh and the Sunday School is able to have a beginning and an end each year – a concept with which the children are familiar. The earlier time is meant to help accommodate people with Summer outdoor activities planned so typical Summer attrition is limited.

Also, it is my deep and abiding hope that, following three months of 9:00 AM Worship, the schedule for many will not change and 9:10 AM Bible Class will become a part of the Sunday morning routine. We will have to wait and see in September.

I am very excited about what is happening here at Our Redeemer. It makes the task so much more enjoyable when we join together and share the load. We have had a very good response for VBS volunteers – but we could always use another helping hand. We are anticipating an even bigger crowd than last year. Invite your friends and neighbors to come. Also, the Sunday the VBS kids sing in church will be our first 9:00 AM service. What a joy it will be for our visitors to see the excitement of that week come to a climax with the sanctuary full of God's people worshiping our risen Lord.

The changes to the schedule are being done in the hope that this will aid our Church in the proclamation of the Gospel – which, of course, is the real focus of all our activity.
