

The Lutheran Church --- Missouri Synod

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To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I wanted to take this opportunity to express my joy and excitement about the approval of our Sunday School renovation project and the upgrading of our sound system in the sanctuary. We have made a significant investment in the future of our church. I will share details with you in the near future.

However, so that we are sure to maintain unity within our three churches connected to St. James Lutheran School there is the need to discuss our decision concerning the proposed school association. Below is a copy of a letter sent to St. James and St. John recounting the events of our May 20 Voter's Meeting:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

At the Voter's Meeting held on May 20, Our Redeemer Lutheran Church has voted to continue the discussion concerning making changes to the structure of St. James Lutheran School. In regard to some of the stated goals of the St. James School Association Study Committee:

- We are in favor of continuing the discussion of changing the tuition structure of St. James Lutheran School.
- The consensus is that we will do whatever is needed to provide excellence in education for our children. This includes additional financial support for St. James if they endure future deficits.
- We are already discussing how to change the percentage of tuition paid by parents so that our practice is in line with the other two churches.
- We believe further discussion is needed concerning the authority of the school board as presented by the Association Study Committee.

However, it is the consensus that the goals of the association can be achieved without subjecting our churches to the inherent risks found in a formal association where the school is attached to one congregation in the association. There is the danger of the inability to act and make the necessary decisions needed to maintain a level of excellence in the school.

After much discussion, we voted to continue pursuing these goals but suggest that this pursuit be apart from any formal association. After this vote was taken, Pastor Eden then told us of his experience as a youth and we were confident we made the right decision:

In 1974-75, five churches formed a formal association with Martin Luther School in Louisville, KY, where previously there had been a loose association of churches similar to our current situation. In 1976, when Pastor Martin Eden began attending, there were 248 students in Martin Luther School. Five churches supported the school. The school was on the property of Pilgrim Lutheran Church, a congregation of 743 baptized members and averaged 278 in attendance each Sunday. Pilgrim owned the high school sized gymnasium on the property which was rented by the school for athletic events, served

as the lunch room, housed the library, and had a stage large enough for all joint church and school functions. The school building was owned by the association.

When Pastor Eden graduated in 1982, Martin Luther School was down to 118 students. In 1988, there were 105 students. In 1989, the school closed. By 2005, Pilgrim Lutheran Church closed its doors and the facility remains an empty shell to this day.

In 1990, Our Savior Lutheran Church established a school and operates it much in the way we currently do with the other Lutheran churches supporting it through sending students. Their 2011 enrollment is 217 students.

After the association was formed, it became very difficult to accomplish the work needed to be done because the other four churches did not see eye to eye with Pilgrim on how money should be spent on the facility. Rev. Roger Eden recounted to Rev. Martin Eden the numerous meetings debating who owned the parking lot and what percentage of the electric bill for the gymnasium should be paid by the school association. Pilgrim had a differing opinion than the other four churches.

The danger of entering into a formal association is that the Voter's Assemblies of Our Redeemer and the Lutheran Church of St. John would not see eye to eye with the members of St. James in regard to usage of the school facility or when there is a need for any remodeling or upgrades exceeding the \$15,000 threshold.

We believe that much good has come out of this discussion and we are filled with joy that our three congregations have a common goal of providing excellence in Lutheran education through the ongoing work of St. James Lutheran School. We believe that many of the goals of the Association Study Committee can be accomplished without the formal association.
