To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

The participation of a Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod pastor in a joint prayer service has received much media coverage following the horrific slaying of innocent children and adults in a Newtown, CT school. Both Rev. Morris and the Rev. President Harrison (current LCMS president) wrote letters on the issue. Rev. Pres. Harrison stated in his letter that participation in the event went beyond what is allowed by the Scripture, Confessions, and the teaching of our synod drawn from them. Rev. Morris issued a letter of apology to those who believed he was wrong for participating. These letters, and the media coverage, have sparked numerous comments. I encourage you to read these letters at www.lcms.org as there are those in the media who are casting stones without the understanding of Scripture or why we believe what we believe.

Our churches, like our nation, were horrified at the killing of children. If only our nation were horrified at the 3000+ children killed each day in abortion clinics, but that is a topic for another day. Rev. Morris, his congregation, and his entire community were, and remain, in need of spiritual care. In our Lutheran Confessions, we teach that we are to call upon the name of our Lord "in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks." Jesus says, "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you" (Mt. 6:5-6).

Instead of following this advice, Rev. Morris gave a public "benediction" (a blessing) of an event that would be best described as "moralistic, therapeutic, deism." (This is a concept that has been discussed recently at the Quincy Bible Institute and in sermons. If you need more clarity, please google that phrase for there is not enough room in this letter to give an accurate description). Rev. Morris was in error for doing this. He, along will all the pastors of our church, took vows at ordination not to engage in such activities because, among other places in God's Word, St. Paul says, ""Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? And what fellowship has light with darkness? What accord has Christ with Belial? Or what portion does a believer share with an unbeliever?" (2 Corinthians 6:14-15).

Scripture is very clear that when disaster strikes, Jesus did not encourage His disciples to seek out the Pharisees, Sadducees, priests of Baal, Molech, Zeus, and Athena so that they could hold hands and pray with a unified voice. The Old and New Testaments are filled with examples of this kind of activity being very displeasing to God.

With that in mind, it is important to realize that Rev. Pres. Harrison has heard Rev. Morris' apology and has offered full and complete forgiveness. Yet, there are some outside of the LCMS who call Rev. Pres. Harrison's actions "hateful." How can forgiveness be hateful? In our church, like in Scripture, forgiveness means that God "remembers the sin no more" (Jer. 31:34). Therefore those who want to dredge up or continue the turmoil are clearly not from God.

We pray for our church and for Rev. Pres. Harrison to continue to "speak the truth in love" (Eph. 4:15) which St. Paul says is what allows the church to find true unity and fellowship in Christ. In the aftermath of a horrific tragedy in Newtown, CT, we are compelled to come to God in prayer. For Rev. Morris, his family, the people of Christ the King Lutheran Church, and all the families of Newtown, CT, I encourage you to "go into your room and shut the door and pray" (Mt. 6:6).


