To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

In the coming weeks, any parent or grandparent with school-age children will be experiencing a change in their schedule. Some of the "back-to-school" advertisements strive for a humorous look at this change with frowning children accompanied by joyous parents as school resumes. This is the stereotypical view of modern family life. However, in reality, most parents will miss having the kids around during the day, and most kids will look forward to getting back into the school routine – even the learning part.

I know that most of the youth who would read this would publicly reject that notion (especially if their friends were near). However, the truth is that children appreciate structure. They also enjoy learning. It gives them a sense of accomplishment. Learning is empowering. Why do you think that children ask so many questions? They do not like being ignorant. They want to know things and grow in their understanding of the world around them. Certainly, there is no age or level of learning that allows anyone to have all the answers, but having knowledge helps to take away fear of the unknown. Gaining knowledge and finding answers to your questions takes a lifetime of learning, and learning doesn't end when you put your diploma on the wall.

The same is true of the knowledge of God, yet it is different. Learning about our Creator and Redeemer, as God is revealed through His Word and the work of the Holy Spirit, is empowering. It takes away fear of the unknown. Yet, a baptized infant already has everything needed for salvation. Having been washed clean of all sin, the fullness of God's grace is upon that child. There is no age or level of knowledge acquired that makes you more ready to receive God's grace, just like there is no "age of accountability" when suddenly you are accountable for you sins (as if Baptism was unnecessary prior to that age).

Our place in this world is simple: we were born in the total corruption of the sin of Adam. We are saved by grace through faith, it is a gift from God, apart from our works [Eph. 2:8-9]. The message is so simple, yet we have a million questions about God and the meaning of life. We are children in need of learning. Certainly, there is no point in this life when everything about the complexity of God will be fully understandable. He is incomprehensible. Yet, we strive to know Him through a lifetime of learning because knowledge of Him takes away fear of the unknown – even the fear of death.

As Sunday School and Bible classes resume at Our Redeemer, I encourage you to make use of the opportunities for you and your children to grow in your knowledge and love of the Lord. Sunday August 25 is when we will return to our regular schedule with the Divine Service at 8:00 and 10:15 with Sunday School and Adult Bible class in between. If regular participation in Bible class has not been part of your schedule, I encourage you to start a new routine. Join in the lifetime of learning which began at your Baptism.

LCMS Responds to Oklahoma Tornado

In the wake of the monstrous tornado that struck Moore, Okla., and severe storms that affected other areas of the Midwest yesterday, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) asks for prayers and financial gifts to help those affected by the disaster.

The Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, president of the LCMS, and the Rev. John Fale, associate executive director of the LCMS' Mercy Operations Group, have been in contact with LCMS Oklahoma District President Rev. Barrie E. Henke to begin assessing needs in Moore and plan the church's long-term disaster response plan.

"The needs are going to be huge," Fale said. "We don't know yet the extent of what they will be, but, by the grace of God, we will be there to respond with the love and mercy of Christ to help those affected by the tornado to regain some sense of normalcy."

The EF4 tornado destroyed parts of Moore and killed at least 24 people. Before striking Moore, the tornado touched down in Newcastle, Okla., about 10 miles away.

"We know there are many people who wish to participate in bringing tangible relief to those who suffer from disasters," Fale added. "Those who wish to volunteer with response efforts in Oklahoma are asked to wait for the assessment of the damages and the needs. In the meantime, the best way to support our Synod's relief effort is by contributing to the LCMS' general disaster fund."
