To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

On Reformation Sunday, I stated that the Reformation starts in your home. Be serious about who God is. Make sure that everyone else in your household knows that God is important to you, that He is worthy of attention, and He deserves fear, honor, love, and trust.

If you are a Christian and believe all that God has done for you (salvation through Christ's death and resurrection), then He certainly deserves fear, honor, love, and trust above all things. Unfortunately, our world views Christ and His Church with the same attitude as a casual or fair weather fan views the full season of a baseball team. They will pay attention if there is something exciting going on like the World Series, but only if their team is in it. They will pay attention to Jesus coming into the world to suffer and die for our sins, if there is something exciting like Christmas – and if their child or grandchild is in the Christmas program. But the rest of the time, it is sort of like the 162 games of the regular season in baseball. And they cannot understand why anyone would go and watch Spring Training.

The casual fan will occasionally look at the standings or be glad to see a winning score. They might even watch or attend a game now and then but would never consider being a season ticket holder – even though being a season ticket holder assures you that you get to see the final victory in the World Series.

I know that this is a profoundly bad analogy. You cannot purchase a ticket to heaven the way you purchase a season ticket to for the St. Louis Cardinals. Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses to challenge the notion that you can purchase your way to heaven.

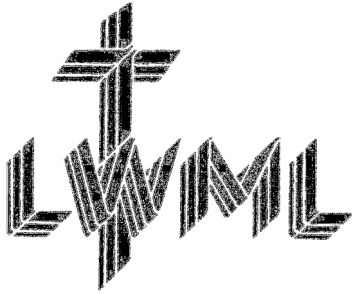
The point I am making is that it is OK to be a casual fan of a baseball team. There is nothing wrong with only getting excited about your team when they are in the World Series every few years (or every few hundred years as the case may be). Even if you cannot name two players on the team when they are playing “meaningless” games in June and July, you get to celebrate just as triumphantly as the season ticket holder when they win the World Series. (I am writing this with the Cardinals behind in the series 3-2. I have no idea who is going to win the baseball games.)

However, the person who takes the same attitude toward Christ and His suffering and death will not be rejoicing in Christ's victory at the end of the season. The Sundays in November are celebrated by the Church as a reminder that the season is coming to an end. From All Saints' Day through the final Sunday of the Church Year – sometimes called the Sunday of the Fulfillment or Christ the King Sunday – we turn our attention to the need for all people to turn their attention to Christ and what He has done. The victory is His already. He secured that on the cross and in the empty tomb. C.S. Lewis wrote, “Christianity, if false, is of no importance, and if true, of infinite importance. The only thing it cannot be is moderately important.”
