To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

When we talk about stewardship within the church, we often refer to the giving of "time, talents, and treasure." Sometimes, we forget the reason why we make the sacrifice. It is wrong to simply say He deserves our best. He deserves everything we have. We have nothing to offer except that which God has already given.

If we gave all that we had, even our own life, we still would not be able to give to Him what He deserves. Thanks be to God that He is gracious, doesn't tie our salvation to our works, and only asks that we give our first-fruits to Him as a show of love, honor, and thanks.

Every moment of time is a gift from God. There is no greater gift that you can give than a portion of your time. I am a strong advocate of tithing your time. If you can spend nine hours preparing for and enjoying a Super Bowl party, you can spend one hour devoted to the Lord. This goes beyond just showing up for worship on Sunday morning.

The operative questions are, "How much time do I give to myself? And how much time do I give to the Living God?" Add up the time you spend this week watching TV, playing video games, or looking at a computer. This doesn't even touch on going out to dinner, engaging in a hobby, or other "fun" activities. The sad irony is that some people will skip church so that they can get ready for their Super Bowl party. Everyone gives time to a god. How you spend your time speaks volumes about who your god really is.

The use of your talents has a similar theme. Just as God has not given you time simply for your own whim of pleasure, so also every gift and talent you have is not for your personal benefit. The blessings of your various talents have been given for the purpose of benefiting others in general and Christ's Church in particular. St. Paul speaks of the members of the body of Christ working together for the good of the body. He says, "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness" [Rom. 12:6-8].

Paul speaks of generosity, zeal, and cheerfulness. At Our Redeemer, we have been blessed with many who have demonstrated these characteristics in regard to their giving of time, talent, and treasure. Making this sacrifice has allowed the Gospel to faithfully be proclaimed for many years in this place. We are thankful for the greater sacrifice that God has made in sending His Son. For this He does not deserve our best, He deserves everything we have which would still not be enough. We give thanks that our salvation is not tied to our works. All that He has ever asked of His children is to acknowledge His grace by returning the first-fruits of what He has given.


