To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Following much discussion between the pastors and elders of the three Quincy churches, all three churches have decided on a change in our Confirmation instruction and are moving to separate First Communion from the Rite of Confirmation. This is a growing practice in LCMS churches and is a change that my father introduced the final 14 years of his ministry.

Tying Confirmation and First Communion together around or near the 8th grade year is something that has only been done in the past few centuries and has never been adopted universally as the preferred practice. It became convenient for the pastor to teach this age in the early days of the LCMS when most of the youth were being taught in Lutheran schools, and the combination of Pietism and Rationalism made intellectual achievement the threshold for gaining access to the Lord's Table. If you want details on the history of this, I will be happy to speak with anyone wanting more information.

There are numerous reasons to make this change. First, our current practice contradicts our teaching in regard to who is worthy of receiving the sacrament. St. Paul says that a person needs to "examine himself" [1Cor. 11:28], that is, as the catechism states, we are to examine ourselves to see whether "we are sorry for our sins, and that we believe in our Savior Jesus Christ, and we plan, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to change our sinful lives." Also, we are to "discern," or recognize, the body of Christ in the sacrament. "For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself" [1Cor. 11:29]. Last year, as I was preparing the 8th graders for receiving Holy Communion, my 7th graders pointed out to me that they were also prepared. We, as a church, are currently denying the body and blood of Christ to those who are worthy under the biblical (and Lutheran) definition, who are wanting to be in communion fellowship as members of our congregation, and who desire to receive it.

Another prime reason for making this change is that what we are doing has not been working for decades. On average, within one year of 8th grade Confirmation, half of the class will fall away from regular church attendance. The problem for our high school age youth is that they perceive that they have no place in the church. For 14 years or so, their experience in the church has been a combination of youth outings, Sunday School, and worship without receiving the body and blood of Christ. This is why it is important to be actively engaged with your children in worship. Teach them the liturgy. Teach them to speak and sing back to God the words of Scripture He has given, and bring them to Sunday School to learn the Word of God.

For the high school age Christian who has not been actively engaged in the Word of God outside of Confirmation class, who no longer attends Sunday School, and whose memory of life in the church is mostly of going on scavenger hunts or to a "lock-in" with other youth, this person will undoubtedly look at the faith of their youth as something that they have "outgrown." Participating in the body and blood of Christ for four years or so will be of great benefit not only in giving them the blessings of forgiveness, life, and salvation offered in that flesh and blood, but it will also give them a history of receiving the sacrament. They will be participating with the adults at the Lord's Table and will hopefully have a seamless transition into adult life. Confirming the faith of your Baptism will still be an important milestone, but it will no longer be viewed as a "graduation" or "hoop" that the church makes you jump through at a certain age to make you worthy of the sacrament.

For those who desire to commune prior to Confirmation, our plan is to offer instruction classes for our youth and their parents (this is important and required for those families who want to participate). We set the age for receiving this instruction as those who are entering into 5th grade or older. I understand that this is just as arbitrary of an age limit as Confirmation in 8th grade. However, the three churches wanted to act uniformly and this was the age with which everyone was comfortable. This may change in the future, if a change is warranted.

This year, classes will be held during the Sunday School hour in June and August. We are still working out exact details, but we will be meeting June 8, 15, and 22. Then, we will be off for five weeks and reconvene Sunday School on August 3. There will be a little "homework" during that time. During the month of August, two or three weeks of Sunday School will be devoted to this instruction. We will need to evaluate where we are. I will speak to the families as to which weeks will best suit their schedule. As this is something new, there may be a few bumps in the road, however I am excited to venture out into this new territory. My father said that instituting a similar program was the single best change he made in his 40 years of ministry.

Ultimately, this program is designed to get the entire family involved together around God's Word and Sacrament. We want to break down generational segregation. Do not think that young children cannot learn and "inwardly digest" the truth of God's Word. Everyone is invited and encouraged to refresh their minds in regard to what is Baptism and how your baptismal faith is lived out in the Word and Sacrament ministry of Christ's Church. I look forward to embarking on this new journey together.

Therefore the total income in January is actually \$19, 520.53 and the total expenses were \$44,677.47 leaving a deficit of -\$14,156.94 for the month.
