Board of Directors Review

At its March 2014 meeting, the CID Board of Directors heard a presentation from Rev. Tom Phillips on work in the District among the deaf. CID is one of only four districts directly supporting deaf ministry, and it continues to receive growing emphasis within the District.

In other business:

- Mr. Dave Rohe reported that every mortgage held by CID CEF was eligible for a mortgage interest rebate grant (for mortgages not more than 30 days past due).
- The Evangelism Commission reports that the new Evangelism Handbook is available on the District's website as a PowerPoint presentation so that congregations may have easy access to it.
- Board adopted a Marriage Policy to help protect district staff, missionaries-at-large, campus pastors, and all others called by the District from any legal action arising under recent changes in the marriage laws of Illinois.
- Congregational constitution changes for Holy Cross Moline were accepted.
- Discussion continues between the (CID) Congregational Constitution and District Handbook Committee and the (Synodical) Commission on Constitutional Matters to address updates to the District's Articles of Incorporation that stem from recent Synodical convention action.
- A bequest was received by the District. Board voted, per its usual practice, to immediately forward 10% to the Synod in support of national/international mission efforts.

The afternoon was spent in dialogue with Synodical 1st Vice President Herb Mueller and Regional Vice President Daniel Preus as they conducted their official visit. Such visits were emphasized at the last Synodical Convention.

Reading your child's mind

New babies rely on adults for their physical survival, but as they grow they need even more than that. Children also depend on their parents for their emotional and physical development.

Consequently, being a good parent means helping your children understand themselves, their emotions, their thoughts and the connection between themselves and the world around them. Just as a good parent must read the child's physical needs (for food, naps, etc.), the parent must also read the child's emotional and intellectual needs.

Meeting a child's emotional needs is critical if the child is to become a stable adult. According to psychoanalyst Erik Erikson, children must first learn to trust the adults in their lives to provide nurturing and comfort. Erikson also noted that children need to deal with shame and doubt. Parents must know when their children are experiencing these feelings and help them restore a feeling of "I'm ok." If a child establishes a sense of trust and is not overwhelmed with shame, Erikson believes a child will have hope and motivation to deal properly with the ongoing stages of development.

As they become young adults, children must deal with feelings like guilt and inferiority that come up around the issues of identity and intimacy. When we feel guilty or that we are not "good enough," these negative feelings can undermine our sense of autonomy, the feeling that "I can do it."

When children get frustrated and angry because they cannot do something, parents must understand that they are feeling a sense of failure and then intervene to help them accomplish the task or to deal with the reality of occasional failure.

Once parents have an idea of what is going on in their children's minds, they can help them find words for their feelings. This task is very important because it is through language that people can have a stable sense of identity. Language helps people move beyond confusion and deal with their worlds more confidently.

You and your family do not have to struggle alone. LCFS counselors help families generate hope and cope with life's challenges. 
