To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

As we pause a little in our regular calendar activities for the summer, I want to draw attention to the great work that is done at Our Redeemer which allows me to focus on the Word and Sacrament ministry to which I have been called. I am not joking when I say that all I have to do for VBS is show up and play with puppets. All of the decorations and preparations and food etc. happens without me. Likewise, the entire Sunday School program functions with my duties simply being to show up and teach the Word of God. You have no idea what a blessing this is to a pastor. Even the coffee, cookies, etc. happen without me needing to do anything (other than occasionally picking up a can of coffee at Sam's).

In recent weeks, when there was a need for some work to be done because we think the foundation is settling in the old chapel, some workers were at the church one morning when I arrived. They told me what they were doing. I contacted a couple of council members and they told me that I didn't need to worry about it, because this was all part of the plan. You have no idea what a blessing this is to a pastor.

The special music each week for the choirs and soloists is all chosen and practiced without my needing to be intimately involved. I am amazed at how well the music seems to always fit with the theme of the day.

Bulletins and newsletters are assembled by a faithful crew (who wouldn't mind extra hands). However, if you come to join them, make sure you are early because they are usually finished before their appointed starting time.

On Saturdays, I come to prep for worship around 3:00 PM and the Sacramental elements are on the altar, and most weeks the hymn boards are already changed (even though that is not technically part of the Altar Guild's duty).

There are those who replenish the attendance and communion cards and make sure your pencils are sharp. On Monday morning, the offering is counted and taken to the bank without me having to check up on them or give any instruction.

The sermon usually gets posted online before I get home for my Sunday afternoon nap (Keith and Craig would not mind a little help with that either because they are not always able to be here). The newsletter, bulletin, and Sunday to Sunday are ready for publication with me needing only to give it a final proofread (in fact, I would not have had this letter ready had Evelyn not reminded me on Tuesday).

I know that I will be leaving out someone who does the work that makes my job easy – and I apologize ahead of time. The whole point that I am trying to make can be seen in the microcosm of VBS week. We had over 70 children participate – which is fantastic. But what caught my attention is that we had 59 helpers. I am the envy of all my brother pastors.

It takes 59 (non-children) to provide that experience we shared during VBS. It takes many teachers to make Sunday School be the place where our children can come and hear more about the Word of God. Using the variety of skills God has given or simply using the time God has given, there are numerous opportunities to serve your Lord and be of benefit to His church.

I am thankful for all of the people I see passing through Our Redeemer throughout the week. What brings me joy is that everyone who passes through these doors has the common purpose that God's Word would be heard and received and carried into the world so that others may share the joy that we know.


