Authoritative parenting

One of the most challenging issues facing parents today is how to raise responsible, well-adjusted children in a world of conflicting messages and value systems.

The style of parenting children encounter greatly influences their outlook not only on themselves and their families, but also the world. Parenting can be broadly classified into four general styles: authoritative (democratic), authoritarian (dictatorial), permissive and negligent.

These styles are based on two basic characteristics: the ability to be responsive to a child's needs and feelings (responsiveness) and the ability to set reasonable boundaries and limits (demandingness).

Authoritative parents tend to perform tasks with their children that are high in **both** responsiveness and demandingness. Research has demonstrated that these children tend to do better in school, demonstrate respect for others, posses higher levels of self-esteem, are able to take responsibility for their actions and display higher levels of self-discipline. The following are characteristics of authoritative parents:

- Able to establish and enforce limits and boundaries and adjust them when necessary.
- Listen to and repeat back children's thoughts and feelings without judging them (active listening).
- Establish consistency in family life.
- Are warm and supportive of their children's needs and interests.
- Promote and demonstrate mutual support.

Remember, it is important not to look at isolated, specific behaviors when trying to understand one's parenting style. It reflects a general attitude and consistent pattern of behavior over a period of time.

You and your family do not have to struggle alone. LCFS counselors help families generate hope and cope with life's challenges.
