To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Entering into the Advent and Christmas seasons, we are reminded of who we are. We are God's children who are blessed to have received our adoption into His family. We celebrate the birth of Christ who has saved us through His death and resurrection. We wait for Him to return once again and we express a willingness to sacrifice of ourselves for the sake of Christ and His church. This is the focal point of our existence and everything else is outside noise. The world around us has created much "noise" which can be a distraction. It is my prayer that during these weeks filled with many celebrations and temptations for excess (the opposite of sacrifice), we would be able to filter out the noise and hear the clear voice which God intends.

During our Wednesday Advent services, we are turning our attention to John the Baptist, "the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way of the Lord." Please join us as we listen to the witness of his voice. At Christmas, we will hear the voice of the angels who bring "Good news of a great joy which shall be for all the people." Please join us as we listen to the witness of their voices. All throughout these weeks, we will hear the voice of the prophets of God preparing God's people for Jesus to come. Please join us.

Throughout our lives, but especially at this time of year, God's people are preparing for Christ to come, and we celebrate His coming as the child born in Bethlehem. It seems confusing that we celebrate His coming with watchful anticipation for His coming once again, but our reason for doing this becomes clear when we understand that the Advent and Christmas seasons are distinct and separate seasons. Please join us throughout these seasons.

Whether we are watching for Him to come or celebrating that He has come, I pray these weeks ahead are filled with the clear voice of God's witness that the Messiah promised to Adam and to all of his children is the Christ-child born of Mary. Please join us as we celebrate this "good news of a great joy" with watchful anticipation for Him coming once again. Everything else is outside noise.





Holiday Stress

The holiday season is here and many of us are feeling pressure. Shopping, going to parties, baking and many other activities in addition to our normal tasks can leave us feeling exhausted. We always have more projects than we have time for. We often have more socializing than we feel up to.

The holidays bring different memories and feelings to each of us. For some, the holidays are a very joyous time, for others they are very emotional and bring up feelings of holidays long past.

It is important to know that symptoms of stress vary with each individual. During the holidays some people have trouble falling or staying asleep. Some wake up early, while others have trouble getting up in the morning. Some gain weight; others have headaches or mood swings. Some experience an inexplicable sadness, while others may miss loved ones who are no longer here.

It is important to remember the holiday blues are often short-lived and a reaction to the stress of the holiday season. Although some stress is good, too much stress can make us feel overwhelmed and exhausted. Here are some things that may help you manage the season:

- Plan your time and recognize that it is ok to say "no." Don't over-schedule yourself.
- Set your priorities and let the less important things wait.
- Recognize that not everything can or has to be perfect.
- Delegate tasks to other family members.
- Don't overindulge in sweet, high-calorie food. Eat regular meals, especially lots of fruits and vegetables. Watch your intake of alcohol and tobacco.
- Try to get 6-8 hours of sleep every night.

If you recognize that stress or the holiday blues continue beyond the holidays, they may be symptoms of a more-serious problem. If that's the case, it may help to speak with a mental-health professional.

You and your family do not have to struggle alone. LCFS counselors help families generate hope and cope with life's challenges.
