Teasing: one child's taunt, another child's pain

Learning to get along in the world means learning how one's words and actions affect others. In infancy and toddlerhood, a child is "me" oriented. However, she begins to learn that when you smile people smile back and when you take a toy from someone he cries. Unfortunately these lessons are not easily remembered when a child is ten years old and calling someone names.

It is important to discuss the issue of teasing with your child. She may readily admit that someone has called her a name, but may be more reluctant to say she has done the same. Don't assume your child has never put down another child with words. She probably has.

Help children understand the long-term impact that name calling can have on another person. Be willing to share a story of your own experiences to help children understand that teasing is not something that one easily forgets.

Children tease other children because they may be hurting inside and it's their way of getting the hurt out. Sometimes teasing is done to win points with friends. If everybody laughs when someone calls someone else a name, he gets reinforced for it. It may be a group thing to exclude and put down a child "who doesn't belong."

Remember that children learn by example. Think about what your words and actions teach them. Have you ever seen an old car that was beat up and commented on how horrible it looked or how you would never drive a car like that? The comment doesn't seem too bad, but the subtle statement is that there is something wrong or degrading about driving such a car. What if the car belonged to the parents of one of your child's classmates? Would your child shun the classmate because of your comments?

It is easier to remember the worst thing said to you yesterday than the best. Teach your children by word and action to have consideration and respect for themselves by having consideration and respect for others.
