

Maintaining a healthy balance in our lives

"I feel like my job is consuming my life," said Karen. "I put in extra hours, worry about work when I'm away from the office and find it hard to take a vacation without feeling guilty." Karen is not alone in her situation. Many people feel that a certain aspect of their lives is overpowering the other facets of their lives.

Throughout nature, you see that things have a certain symmetry to them. We see that balance in flowers, trees and even people's faces. When we write, we like to center our words on the paper. We place a bouquet of flowers in the middle of a table. It is pleasing to the eye to have things equal on each side of that imaginary dividing line.

When we speak about the balance of nature, we refer to the fact that too much or too little of something throws everything off. Too much rain means floods, soil erosion and plants that decay from all the moisture. Too little rain results in droughts and plants that wither and die. Fortunately, nature is forgiving and allows a little bit of leeway.

Our lives are also about balance. Too much or too little of any one thing can throw our lives out of kilter.
