To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

After several years of experimenting with our summer schedule, the voters have approved (by a 42-11 vote in favor) the Elder's recommendation to continue with the 9:00 a.m. Sunday service throughout the year. During the meeting, as the church family came together to discuss this possible change and knowing that change is often difficult and uncomfortable, I knew that there were differing opinions. I even made the comment beforehand that I was uncomfortable because in my 20 years as a pastor, I can only remember one vote that wasn't unanimous.

However, I found the discussion to be very heartening. Although there were some with concerns (concerns which also I had three years ago when we began this experiment), what heartened me is that we can come together as a church family, have a sincere discussion about something which will cause all of us to endure change, and we are able to have that discussion in such a civil and Christian manner. It is truly a joy to be the shepherd of this flock.

With this change, our worship schedule will continue with a 5:00 p.m. service on Saturday and a 9:00 a.m. service on Sunday. However for special holidays, we will have two services on Sundays. On Palm Sunday we will have services at 8:00 a.m. and at 10:15 a.m. because this is our Confirmation Day, and we will continue to have a 6:30 a.m. Sunrise service on Easter in addition to our 9:00 a.m. service.

Sunday School and Adult Bible class are scheduled to start at 10:10 a.m. immediately following worship and classes will be finished by 11:00 a.m. Sunday School Rally Day is on Sunday, September 13. Please encourage all Our Redeemer children to attend Sunday School this year so that they may grow in Christ.

I pray this change will be a blessing to our congregation as we gather together as a family around God's Word and Sacraments.



In January 1955 the Voters made the two services per Sunday schedule a permanent arrangement. Occasionally, only one service per Sunday was held, for example, in January and in July.

History Hints – Do You Remember?

In 1959, the Rev. E. T. Otto, Pastor Otto's father, moved to Quincy and began almost nine years of service to Our Redeemer with pastoral assistance, calling at local nursing homes, etc. He served until his death in 1967.

In 1968, the Christmas Eve Candlelight Service at 10:30 p.m. was added to the worship schedule, and the Christmas Day service was dropped. The Candlelight Service was dear to the heart of our Senior Choir Director, Mrs. Annaliese Taute, who knew it from her growing up years in Germany. [The Christmas Day Service was restored in 1987.]

In 1970, Saturday evening services were begun as an experiment by all three Quincy LCMS congregations. A Communion service was held on the Saturday before the first Sunday of the month. The first such service was held at St. James in September, at Our Redeemer on October 3, and at The Lutheran Church of St. John on October 31. After a while, St. James and St. John's dropped the Saturday evening services. Our Redeemer continued and added a second such service each month in January 1988. At that time the schedule was altered slightly so that services were held on the first and third Saturdays of each month.
