To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

October is finally here!! All year we have been gearing up and building toward the celebration of Our Redeemer's 75th Anniversary. I am especially grateful for all the volunteers who have given of their time to bring the history of our church to life. On the final two Sundays of the month we will be having special events celebrating our history by rejoicing in our present with great hope for our future.

On October 18, we are welcoming Rev. Larry Troxel as a guest preacher. Having served as pastor here from 1982-2009, Pastor Troxel played an important role in the history of this congregation. Rev. Otto and Rev. Brechbuhl are the only other pastors to serve this parish. Our Redeemer is unique in that this congregation has never been vacant. There has never been a time when you did not know who God had given as the shepherd of this flock. I believe the stability and continuity created by long-tenured pastors has been very beneficial to the long-term stability and family atmosphere of our church.

On October 25, as the church observes Reformation Day, we will remember the 75 years of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church as we remember the nearly 500 years of Lutheran heritage. Although Our Redeemer was never a congregation which conducted services in the German language, we will be conducting the Divine Service in German that day (don't worry, I will preach in English). The liturgy and much of the singing will be in German.

The German Service on Reformation Day will be at 10:00 AM. There will be no Saturday evening worship or Sunday School that weekend. Following the service, everyone is invited to stay for a turkey dinner. There will be sign-up sheets for attendance and for helping to bring food and supplies.

We are very excited and blessed to be able to celebrate this milestone in the history of our church. It is important to remember from where you have come. I am even more excited about where I see us going in the future as we continue to faithfully proclaim the mercy and grace found in our crucified and risen Redeemer.

Easing Children's Fears
