#### To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Each January as we hang the new calendar on the wall, we have a heightened reality that time is moving forward. I have always been fascinated by the dimension of life we call time. One of the many reasons I long for Jesus to return is that we will never again be concerned about time or the passing of years.

When I got my first transistor radio and could listen to something other than my parent's Statler Brothers 8-track tapes, one of the first songs I can remember really catching my attention was "Time" by Pink Floyd. It is not a happy song. The words are actually really depressing. The best secular music tends to offer a great diagnosis of the disease of sin. We only find the cure when we look to Christ. This entire song is about the wasted years of waiting around to get started on life. In the first verse the accusation is made, "Ticking away the moments that make up a dull day. You fritter and waste the hours in an offhand way."

Roger Waters, who wrote the song, was focusing solely on the missed opportunities and wasted years of someone not participating in life. However, the pastor in me sees this as having Christ-centered implications also. We "fritter and waste the hours" which could be used in productive devotion to God – Sunday morning worship, devotions with the family, working to help a neighbor in need, etc.

The second verse says, "You are young and life is long and there is time to kill today. And then one day you find ten years have got behind you. No one told you when to run, you missed the starting gun."

Again, the message of the songwriter is for you to get going with your life, but the pastor in me sees this having Kingdom of God application. "You are young and life is long" so the temptation is to put off being serious about time devoted to God. "And then one day you find ten years have got behind you" and not only you but your children have become conditioned to treat God and His Means of Grace (Word and Sacraments) as an afterthought.

The rest of the song focuses on the vain attempt to catch up and make up for the lost and wasted years, but the reality is "Every year is getting shorter never seem to find the time" as you are "Shorter of breath and one day closer to death." As I said, this is not an uplifting song and it ends with the "tolling of an iron bell" (announcing a funeral).

The point of all this is that time is a most precious commodity. We are starting a New Year. The New Year is a celebration of starting over. One of the many blessings of being a forgiven child of God is that we have the opportunity to start over. Even if you have wasted the last "ten years" of your life, Jesus came to make all things new. It is the reality of life after Baptism. As Luther says, "the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

Living under the grace of your Baptism means you are starting over new and fresh each day. Every day is a gift from God. Participate in the new life you have in Christ. I pray no one feels as if "ten years have got behind you," but if they have, now is the time to start over and "emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

# LCFS Clinical Services – January 2016 Depression: the "common cold" of mental health

Joe had been feeling blue for several weeks. His wife noticed he didn't have much energy and was waking early without being able to get back to sleep. She also observed that he wasn't eating much and seemed to be losing weight. His boss noted that Joe wasn't as productive as usual and his coworkers found him to be rather irritable. Joe confided in a friend that he'd been feeling "down."

Joe was showing symptoms of depression, which include:

- · changes in sleep patterns
- · changes in eating patterns weight loss or gain
- · difficulty concentrating
- · changes in mood; irritability
- · lack of energy or pleasure
- · sad, empty feelings
- · helpless and hopeless feelings

As a first step, Joe should get a physical. An evaluation by a doctor can determine whether there is a physical basis for the symptoms. If there appears to be no physical cause, a counselor could help Joe sort out what is causing him to feel depressed. Depression is the "common cold" of mental health, with many different causes. It can stem from problems at work or in one's marriage, the death of a loved one or the transition to a new stage of life. It can also come from a lack of exercise or poor eating habits.



Through counseling, Joe can develop strategies to cope and feel better, such as:

- · structure and routine
- · exercise and eating healthy
- · staying away from drugs and alcohol
- · "self talk" positive messages to himself

Joe could need medication to make it easier to function. After a time, the medication may no longer be necessary. Joe may also need to overcome the embarrassment he feels about his depression. But depression is not a character flaw. It is a real illness, a quite common one, and can be successfully treated.

You and your family do not have to struggle alone. LCFS counselors help families generate hope and cope with life's challenges.
