To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Moses commanded the people: "These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up...Write them on the door frames of your houses and on your gates" [Dt. 6:6-8].

St. Paul reminded Timothy: "But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work" [II Tim. 3:14-171.

Basic biblical knowledge has been on the decline for quite some time. Up until recent times, God's people's lives revolved around the church's schedule on a daily, weekly, and seasonal basis. This is what gave a Christian community the sense of community. The earliest Christians "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer...Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved" [Acts 2:42, 46-47].

Today, even for most church-going people, the Bible remains a closed, mysterious book; and the church is "something you do on Sunday." Scripture is not read in the home, the catechism is not taught to our youth, and the sins of our fathers are visited upon our children. I am guilty of not spending as much time as I should in the instruction of my own children. The unstructured mayhem that our lives become often confuses our daily routine, and time for our Lord is often the first thing to get squeezed.

The Lord has given each of us 168 hours in the week. Allowing for working, school, sleeping, and eating, too few hours remain for the other activities which we want or need to accomplish. How we use those hours speaks volumes as to what is important in our lives. We all make choices to do first things first. The only question is: "What is first?" Where do we place worship and devotion to God in the ranking of important things which must be done? When Jesus says, "Do this in remembrance of Me," are those words which hold value and meaning? These are all questions with which everyone must wrestle.

What is most important to you? When you know the answer to that question, then you will know who is your God. I pray your answer is the same as that of Joshua when he said, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" [Josh. 24:15].
