To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I am very excited to announce that Rev. Peter Kolb will be visiting Our Redeemer on **Sunday, October 15**. We have been supporting the work of Pastor Kolb since he left his church in Vandalia, IL in April of 2015 to serve in Asia. Pastor Kolb lives in Hong Kong where he serves a Lutheran parish. However, he is also the regional chaplain for all of Southeast Asia. This is the largest region covering 12 countries as far away as Papua New Guinea and Sri Lanka.

Pastor Kolb's primary concern is the spiritual wellbeing of the other missionaries and teachers in the region. The LCMS established schools for the Chinese population in Hong Kong in 1949 and Lutheran schools currently enroll thousands of students. The Hong Kong International School alone has 2600 students.

As a regional chaplain, it is important for the missionaries to be connected with pastors who can feed them with God's Word and Sacraments. This is especially important for those who are working in remote areas. I know how much I appreciate my brother pastors and the counsel of my father throughout the years. I can't imagine feeling alone in Sri Lanka. That would make for a very hard ministry.

On **October 15**, Pastor Kolb will be joining us for worship. I am not yet sure if they will be here for Saturday evening worship. I pray his wife and eight children can come also. We haven't discussed who will be preaching wither, but I will be asking him. Following worship on Sunday, Pastor Kolb will share information with us about what he does and what is happening with the spread of the Gospel in Asia.

After his presentation, we will have a meal. Our Redeemer has a long history of supporting mission work around the world. Please make time to join us. There will be future updates as the date draws nearer. In the meantime, keep Pastor Kolb and his family in your prayers, and pray that God continues to bless the spread of the Gospel throughout the world.



LCFS Clinical Services Family Essentials Kit #2 - Trust

July 2017

When we go to the doctor for a checkup or to have them help us with something that is wrong we trust that he/she will be able to alleviate the pain and fix the problem. Most people believe that this trust is just freely given; however, trust is built from many components. In order to build a strong family, trust is an essential part, especially in terms of primary caregivers. When children lose faith in those watching over them, they may turn to others who don't have their best interests at heart.

The first and most influential relationship for a child is with his/her primary caregiver(s). This relationship helps him/her formulate how other relationships will look in the future. Enabling a child to realize that family has his or her best interest at heart helps him/her feel secure in facing struggles and confidence in his/her ability to succeed despite future challenges.

ESSENTIAL KIT ITEM #2 - TRUST

WHAT IT IS - Trust is confident expectation of something, which is formed through the understanding of the other person's knowledge, integrity, ability and actions. We trust doctors because they obtained knowledge in their schooling; through their actions and performance we trust that they will be able to help, and if not that they will be honest about it and send us to someone who can.



HOW IT WORKS - Trust works through the use of unconditional love and intentional, consistent and genuine behaviors. It has to be worked at and if you break someone's trust it is a long process to earn it back. Yet, when you have formed trust in a relationship you are able to reach a deeper level of understanding.

WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE - When trust is formed, you see safety amongst one another. Children are not left wondering when or if their parents will be there for them, and the family in general has less anxiousness or worries about each other.

Trust is built with consistent acts. Consistency is needed in a routine, so when you are more intentional in your routine, trust can be further developed and optimized. Trust is a necessity in order for unconditional love to be openly received.

Watch for next month's Item #3, Family Routine, as we show you the importance of how beneficial a routine is to families.
