To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Throughout the past 2000 years, Christ's Church has placed an emphasis on what is often called evangelism, sharing the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ. I have mentioned in Bible class a few times recently that the church struggles and suffers when the church, the people of God, stop acting like the church. There have been times in history when the church chose not to fight for the truth, but rather, allowed others to silence them. This happened in North Africa in the 600's when the Christians chose to live under Muslim rule (which prohibited any evangelism of non-Christians). The result of this is that North Africa, which at the time was the heart of Christian scholarship and activity is now almost completely devoid of Christians.

We have an obligation to share the Good News. At ORLC, we are adopting a simple invitation, "Come and See." These are the words spoken by Philip to his friend Nathaniel as he informed him that "We have found Him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote" (Jn. 1:45). Each of you has the opportunity to give another person the great gift Philip gave to Nathanael. You can be like Philip, who said, "Come and see."

Someday, perhaps a friend or neighbor, or your child, or your brother or sister will ask himself or herself, "Why do I believe?" The obvious answer is, of course, that it was the work of the Holy Spirit through the Means of Grace – God's Word and Sacrament. But the further question is, "what person did the Holy Spirit use to make an impact on my life?"

When and where did I first hear about Christ and receive faith? For many of us, it was at Baptism – thanks be to God. But that faith needs to be nurtured, just as the child needs to be nurtured. I mentioned in a sermon not too long ago that I have early memories of watching my dad preach and sitting with my mom as she taught me to use the hymnal. Who was it that said to you, "Come and see?" Give thanks to God that He has sent these people into your life, and take the opportunities presented to you to extend that invitation to others.
