To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

In early March, I wanted to get a head start on all things happening in and around Holy Week – including writing my newsletter article since Easter falls on April first this year. And it came to my attention that the Apple Corporation had updated the iPhone and eliminated Good Friday and Easter from the holidays which appear on the phone's calendar. According to their calendar, April Fools' Day was the only significant celebration happening on April first. Not only that, but you could go to the settings on the phone and choose one of the "alternate calendars." Here is a complete list of the alternate calendars available: Chinese, Hebrew, Islamic.

And I wrote about how this episode was a microcosm of this sinful, fallen world. Satan does everything in his power to erase Christ from before our eyes, and when he can't do that he confuses and clutters the world just like the iPhone calendar became cluttered when they restored Good Friday and Easter to the calendar along with numerous Hindu, Moslem, and secular holidays – essentially elevating them to equal status with Good Friday and Easter.

I finished my article and was happy in the knowledge that I had gotten my work done ahead of time, especially leading into the busy time of Holy Week. About two weeks later, as I prepared to send my letter off to Gretchen for publication, I read through it once again and noticed that I had not written anything about Easter and the resurrection of Jesus. My reaction to what Apple had done was not helping the message of "CHRIST IS RISEN!!" to be proclaimed.

It is important to remember that we live in a world which does hate Christ and His Church. I am sure that many secularists and haters of Christ and His Church will make a derogatory connection between Easter and April Fools' Day. It is inevitable and unfortunate, yet why would we expect anything else in this sinful, fallen world.

What is more important is that we do not allow such foolishness to be a distraction and turn away our attention from the cross and empty grave of Jesus on which our eyes are to be fixed at all times. Complaining that the secular world doesn't treat Christian holidays with reverence is a foolish waste of time which could be better spent imparting the wisdom and knowledge of God to our children, our friends, and our neighbors so that they would share the joy of Easter with us and proclaim "CHRIST IS RISEN!! HE IS RISEN INDEED!! ALLELUIA!!
