To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

March 1st was not a particularly noteworthy day as far as the world was concerned, but it was for me. The Lord opened my eyes to see that I was wasting a significant gift he had given me – time. I have always been somewhat of a news junkie. I inherited that trait from my father. When Malinda and were dating, I was the guy tuning in to watch congressional hearings on CSPAN – she married me anyway. In the summer of 2016, I discovered that I could get news faster on Twitter – and I could even tell my dad things that he didn't know about yet.

For more than a year, I was more "in-the-know" than at any point in my life. However, you know there is a problem when your teenage daughters are telling you to get off your phone. So, on March 1st, I deleted Twitter from my phone and opened up the ESV Bible app I had downloaded a few days earlier. I opened the app and read all of Philippians that night. I didn't read it all at once. It was just that when I had the urge to look at my phone and read something, I would read a chapter of the Bible. Philippians is only four chapters long.

The next day, I decided to do something which I have never done before. I was going to start with Genesis and read the Bible cover to cover (even though the Bible on my phone doesn't technically have a cover). I didn't set aside special time for this. I simply used the moments when I was spending five minutes here or ten minutes there reading news on my phone. An average chapter of the Old Testament I have found takes about five minutes to read. I found myself reading about ten chapters per day (and this was without setting aside special time for it). It was simply time waiting for an oil change, or a moment to clear my mind in between tasks, or while using the restroom facilities, or anytime that I otherwise would have been on social media.

As of writing this letter, I am on day 47 of trading in Twitter for the ESV Bible and I am almost finished with 1 Kings. At home and in my office, I have my "reading Bibles" where for years I would flip-flop back and forth from reading an Old Testament book then a New Testament book with a Psalm each day. But "scheduling" that reading time felt more like work than what I am currently doing. I think part of it is that the Bible app does not have any footnotes or even verse numbers. There are only chapter breaks. I have always read the footnotes along with the actual text because my main goal when reading anything has been to learn something. With the Bible on my phone, I just read the Word of God for the sake of hearing the Word of God.

I have to say that these past seven weeks have been very enjoyable and productive. Throughout my ministry, I have always tried to work ahead, but these past weeks, I found myself being able to get my work done even more efficiently. So much so, that I was able to take off Monday of Holy Week and go to St. Louis with my family (I, of course, sinfully gloated about this with my brother pastors).

I still try and find out what is happening in the world, and I still go back and read Study Bible footnotes when I come across something needing further clarification, and I still have my "reading Bibles" with sticky notes marking my progress in reading the OT, NT, and the Psalms. But I have never been as excited about the prospect of sitting in a waiting room while getting an oil change as I have been the past seven weeks.





Martin and Marie Dicke—Missionaries Serving the Lord in Papua New Guinea A Year of Ministry in Review as Lutheran Church Musicians



"Hepi Ista!" ("Happy Easter!") as they say in Papua New Guinea. It has been exactly a year to this day when we landed at Jacksons International Airport in Port Moresby to begin serving as missionaries here (see pic at right for our first view of PNG). To celebrate the anniversary of our ministry here, this expanded newsletter includes pictures that we haven't placed in our newsletters or on our Facebook page (link below). While preparing to come, we discovered that many wondered how musicians could be missionaries. In one sense, the answer is quite simple: Musician missionaries join God's people in celebrating and proclaiming what God has done, especially the mercy He showed through the death and resurrection of His Son Jesus Christ. What we do is nothing new at all. We are simply following the example of the musicians in the Bible, and there were a LOT of them. Music is used throughout the Bible to celebrate God's deeds and proclaim His mercy. In fact, the Book of Job reveals that right after the world was created, the angels were so delighted with what God had done that they formed the first choir and sang for joy (Job 38:7). The Book of Revelation reveals that the Saints and angels sing eternally (Revelation 5 and 15 et al.). There is an ongoing Eternal Song to God and to the "Pikinini Sipsip Bilong God" ("the Lamb of God") and we Christians have the joy and privilege of singing this song.

Martin Luther's many com-ments about music reveal that he under-stood this. Of course, he knew his Bible so well. For more of my own ideas about music and worship, visit my blog at JubalsLyre.com. Some were apparently also concerned that a Lutheran church musician serving as a missionary would simply impose "his" music upon others. First, trying to impose anything never works. In addition, the first task of a Lutheran church musician is to proclaim Jesus Christ and help God's people do the same. Yes, people must have their own song, so a Lutheran church musician must encourage them and help them do that, just as Martin Luther did. But we must understand that our song is enriched immeasurably when we are aware of and sing the songs of the Bible as well as the songs of Christians throughout the ages and throughout the world. Our experience has been that the Christians here want to know these songs and are eager to learn about, hear, and sing them. The needs here are so great that besides serving as musicians, we help in many other ways. Every day is busy and we have already put 15,000 kilometers on our vehicle visiting churches and schools up and down the valley. We were privileged to help the Gutnius Lutheran Church celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation (see p. 3). We could learn a lot from the people here on celebrating the Good News of Jesus Christ.

It has been a privilege and joy to sing the Eternal Song with the people here who sing it with such passion! We look forward to another year of doing the same. Join us in this prayer: O Almighty and eternal God, who through the death of Your Son destroyed sin and death, and by His rising to life again restored innocence and everlasting life, that being delivered from the power of the devil, we might live under You in Your kingdom, grant that we may be forever comforted by true faith in the resurrection of Your dear Son. Guide us with Your holy counsel and when we die, give us the Crown of Life, that with all the holy angels and the Saints we may praise and glorify You eternally. Amen.

Devotional Thought: Missions and the Gospel

Some in the Enga Province scoff at the faithful saying, "Bilong wanem yu ritim Baibel? Em i olpela buk. Em i expire pinis! Nau yu mas harim Spirit tasol." ("Why do you read the Bible? It is an old book. It has expired! Now you must listen to the Spirit only." Dealing with movements and schisms can be difficult. We found the following devotional thought to be very helpful for our work here. It explains what has happened here and why a missionary presence is still needed. It explains why we have a responsibility as a church body to remain here and do what we can to assist the church we helped establish.

The Pure Gospel "The light is among you for a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you." John 12:35 The preaching of the Gospel is not an eternal, lasting, and continuing teaching, but rather is like a traveling rain shower, which moves on. What it hits, it hits, and what it misses, it misses. It does not return, it does not stand still, but the sun and the heat follow and lick it up. Experience shows that in no place in the world has the Gospel remained clear and pure beyond one man's memory. Rather, as long as those who introduced it remained, it continued and increased. When they were gone, the light was also gone, and soon schismatic spirits and false teachers followed So also now, we have the pure Gospel and it is the time of grace and salvation and favorable days (2 Corinthians 6:2), but this will soon be over, if the world stands longer Be careful to receive the Gospel with thanks and fear.
