To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Last year was the "big" celebration of the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther nailing the 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Church. But just because it is year 501 doesn't mean that we can't do something special for Reformation Day. The plan is to go to Concordia Seminary in St. Louis on Wednesday, October 31. We will be leaving ORLC at 6:45 AM. We will attend chapel on campus which begins at 9:35 AM. There will be a guided tour of the campus and lunch in the dining hall (which looks a little bit like the dining hall at Hogwarts – if you have seen the Harry Potter movies, you understand the reference).

After lunch, I would also like to go to the Catholic Basilica (this is where I insert the obligatory joke about nailing something to the door). All kidding aside, Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis rivals any church in the world for its ornate décor. The interior is covered in mosaic. This is the largest collection of mosaic outside of Russia (St. Isaac's Cathedral in St. Petersburg is bigger and is also covered in mosaic, but I believe the St. Louis Cathedral is more beautiful). In the St. Louis Cathedral there are more than 41.5 million pieces of mosaic depicting Bible scenes and other historic events. Pictures on the internet do not do it justice.

Remembering the Reformation of the Church is important every year. The Church is always in need of reformation. That has been the mantra of Confessional Lutherans for centuries.

Our mission goal for this year is \$95,000, of which \$23,750 is sent to fund National Grants.

The LFL of IL Board would like to work to meet this need for families who have a desire to adopt. We are partnering with Lifesong For Orphans ministry to create an adoption fund to be made available to LCMS families in Illinois who need financial assistance as they go through the adoption process. We are asking for churches/Lutheran schools of the CID to prayerfully consider helping us financially to build this fund as well. Once the fund has grown to \$8,000, we would open the fund up for LCMS families to use as they go through the adoption process. Families will be able to submit an application for an adoption grant and Lifesong will review the application. Then Lifesong will give the LFL of IL a recommendation of the amount that could be granted to the adoptive family according to their financial needs.
