To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

As part of our Confirmation curriculum, on **Wednesday, November 7**, the students will be instructed on how to set up for Holy Communion. We are also asking that at least one parent joins them. The idea for this came from our Evangelism Committee and is a good reminder that “evangelism” (i.e. the spread of the Gospel) doesn’t just mean reaching out to people outside of the church. We all are in constant need to learn and grow in our knowledge and understanding of God and His gifts of Word and Sacrament.

I so appreciated this suggestion because it will offer time with the students and parents to talk in detail about the body and blood of Christ and why we handle the consecrated bread and wine with such care and reverence. Handling the elements with care and reverence should be self-evident. After all, how else would you handle the body and blood of the Son of God?

As my dad likes to say, if you want to know what a church really believes about the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament, look to see how the altar guild handles the elements. If they really believe Jesus’ words when He says, “This is My body” and “This is My blood” then those taking care of those elements will treat them with reverence and awe.

I will openly admit that there is an ulterior motive in having the parents involved. It is my hope that families will see doing the work of the Altar Guild as an honor and a privilege to serve the Lord and His church. Going back to the Old Testament, in Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy, there are entire sections devoted to the detail of handling that which is sacred. In I Kings 6-8, where Solomon builds and furnishes the Temple, much detail is addressed in regard to handling that which is sacred.

I could go on and on with biblical references because showing reverence for God by handling sacred things with reverence has always been at the forefront of the worship life of the people of God. Being entrusted with the privilege to handle that which is sacred is no small thing. Serving at the altar of the Lord is also a joyous work. As I like to say, “I have never had a bad day in God’s House.”

We are asking for churches/Lutheran schools of the CID to prayerfully consider helping us financially to build this fund as well. Once the fund has grown to \$8,000, we would open the fund up for LCMS families to use as they go through the adoption process. Families will be able to submit an application for an adoption grant and Lifesong will review the application.
