To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

The season has changed, and the signs are all around us. I am not talking about the weather outside – although snow in the air is a big hint that winter is coming, the weather patterns of Illinois often blur the lines between the seasons. What seems like temperatures that belong in one season and not another tend to find their way across those lines.

The season of the church year has changed. We have completed the long season of Pentecost, and Advent is upon us. Advent marks the beginning of a new church year, and we get to tell the story of Christ from the beginning to the Last Day once again. The signs of this change are obvious as decorations and music fill the sights and sounds of this time of year. The beautiful fall decorations and recognition of the yearly harvest and final harvest are gone. The decorations in the church are filled with meaning and purpose. The Advent wreath has appeared and will now serve as a mini calendar of weeks leading to the celebration of the birth of Christ. The rest of the Christmas decorations are a clear indication that there is a new season upon us. However the themes of this time of year get a little blurry (and not just because there were Christmas decorations in the stores since October). Advent is a time of preparing for Christ to come. In this season is the theme of the journey to Bethlehem, and in this season is the theme of our journey toward the Last Day.

The signs of change are all around us. As we see this change happening, we anticipate what is coming. Christ is coming. During these weeks of Advent, in our Wednesday services, the theme will be "We Begin with the End." In regard to themes of the season, Advent is a season with blurred lines. The Gospel reading for the First Sunday of Advent is Jesus speaking of Judgment Day in Lk. 21:25-36. Advent begins with the End. The season has changed. The signs are all around us. Our task has not changed. Just like in the season of Pentecost, we are to watch and wait because Christ is coming.

The LFL of IL Board would like to work to meet this need for families who have a desire to adopt. We are partnering with Lifesong For Orphans ministry to create an adoption fund to be made available to LCMS families in Illinois who need financial assistance as they go through the adoption process. We are asking for churches/Lutheran schools of the CID to prayerfully consider helping us financially to build this fund as well. Once the fund has grown to \$8,000, we would open the fund up for LCMS families to use as they go through the adoption process. 


Poinsettias for Christmas
