### **To the people of God at Our Redeemer,**

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!! I wish to extend greetings to all our family in Christ during this Christmas Season. As we begin a new year, it is typical to look back at what we accomplished in the past year and to resolve what we desire to accomplish in the year to come.

Looking back to last year, for the ministry of our church, I am most pleased with the addition of broadcasting our worship services through Facebook Live. We typically reach 200-300 people per week who are not able to worship with us. I know that watching it on the computer is a weak substitute for actually being in God's House, but for our shut-in members or those traveling, it helps to keep people connected. Many thanks to Keith Urbon for making this possible. If you know of someone who would enjoy watching the services but is unable to attend (and are perhaps not technologically savvy) helping them to watch or even watching it with them would be a wonderful way to aid in the ministry of their spiritual needs.

Looking forward to this coming year, in addition to getting our basement water problems solved (and our landscaping redone), there is an opportunity for some volunteer work which I am excited about. With the abundance of food in our society, there are still people who go hungry. In Quincy, there is currently no organization which offers meals to those in need on Sundays. We have the opportunity to partner with other churches in providing Sunday evening meals served at Horizons at 224 S. 8<sup>th</sup> St.

We would need a team (or teams) of 10 volunteers to prepare and serve a main course for the meal and then clean up afterwards. Horizons will provide the side dishes and drinks. Thrivent Action Team funds can be used for purchasing the food. Horizons will have a volunteer coordinator present to assist us with any questions. The meal is served from 5:00-6:00PM. They estimate an hour for prep work and an hour for cleanup depending on what food is served. It was suggested that we start with something simple like pizza.

The goal is to have enough churches involved that we would each take four or five Sundays a year. When I first became aware of this opportunity, Jesus words, "When I was hungry you fed Me," kept passing through my mind. Please let me know if you are interested in helping with this endeavor. I believe this will be not only be of benefit and service to our community, but will also be a benefit to those who have the privilege to serve.

**The Lutherans for Life** of Illinois Executive Board is excited to announce a new life-affirming project for Lutheran families in the state of Illinois. Adoption is an expensive endeavor and due to the high costs many couples do not consider adoption as an option in growing their families. The LFL of IL Board would like to work to meet this need for families who have a desire to adopt. We are partnering with Lifesong For Orphans ministry to create an adoption fund to be made available to LCMS families in Illinois who need financial assistance as they go through the adoption process. We are asking for churches/Lutheran schools of the CID to prayerfully consider helping us financially to build this fund as well. Once the fund has grown to \$8,000, we would open the fund up for LCMS families to use as they go through the adoption process. Families will be able to submit an application for an adoption grant and Lifesong will review the application. Then Lifesong will give the LFL of IL a recommendation of the amount that could be granted to the adoptive family according to their financial needs.
