To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

In the coming weeks, any parent or grandparent with school-age children will be experiencing a change in their schedule. Some of the "back-to-school" advertisements strive for a humorous look at this change with frowning children accompanied by joyous parents as school resumes. This is the stereotypical view of modern family life. However, in reality, most parents will miss having the kids around during the day, and most kids will look forward to getting back into the school routine – even the learning part.

I know that most of the youth who read this would publicly reject that notion (especially if their friends were near). However, the truth is that children appreciate structure. They also enjoy learning. It gives them a sense of accomplishment. Learning is empowering. Why do you think that children ask so many questions? They do not like being ignorant, and they soak up information like a sponge. They want to know things and grow in their understanding of the world around them. Certainly, there is no age or level of learning that allows anyone to have all the answers, but having knowledge helps to take away fear of the unknown. Gaining knowledge and finding answers to your questions takes a lifetime of learning, and learning doesn't end when you put your diploma on the wall.

The same is true of the knowledge of God, yet it is different. Learning about our Creator and Redeemer, as God is revealed through His Word and the work of the Holy Spirit, is empowering. It takes away fear of the unknown. Yet, a baptized infant already has everything needed for salvation. Having been washed clean of all sin, the fullness of God's grace is upon that child. There is no age or level of knowledge acquired that makes you more ready to receive God's grace, just like there is no "age of accountability" when suddenly you are accountable for you sins (as if Baptism was unnecessary prior to that age). God's mercy is bestowed upon His children through a sheer act of grace. It is a gift we did not deserve. We did not "learn" to be faithful. God creates faith. However, there is a place for learning within the church.

Our place in this world is simple: we were born in the total corruption of the sin of Adam. We are saved by grace through faith, it is a gift from God, apart from our works [Eph. 2:8-9]. The message is so simple, yet we have a million questions about God and the meaning of life. We are children in need of learning. Certainly, there is no point in this life when everything about the complexity of God will be fully understandable. He is

incomprehensible. Yet, we strive to know Him through a lifetime of learning because knowledge of Him takes away fear of the unknown – even the fear of death.

As we prepare for Sunday School, Confirmation, and Bible classes to resume at Our Redeemer after Labor Day, I encourage you to make use of the opportunities for you and your children to grow in your knowledge and love of the Lord. If regular participation in Bible class has not been part of your schedule, I encourage you to start a new routine. Join us and continue in the lifetime of learning which began at your Baptism.



Former Muslim to speak at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Manito

Hesham Shehab grew up in a world of bitter animosity between Muslims and Christians, which he experienced personally in a physical attack when only about 7. By age 13 he was recruited by the Muslim Brotherhood (Lebanese Chapter) and later fought against Christians in the 1975 war in Lebanon.

In 1980, while Hesham was going to the American University of Beirut, Lebanon (AUB), for premedical studies, his brother was killed by a Christian militia. Hesham's response was to study by day, and by night take out his revenge in attacks on Christians. However, hearing the Sermon on the Mount, in a course of cultural studies (at that college), brought him to faith. Hesham found in Jesus Christ a way of forgiveness and reconciliation with God instead of hatred and revenge. Ultimately, the Lord led Hesham to the vocation of pastor.

In 2008, with the support of local churches, Rev. Shehab planted Salam Christian Fellowship, a mission to Muslims in the western suburbs of Chicago. This mission reaches out to refugees and new immigrants from eight Middle Eastern countries and shares the Gospel with Muslims in three languages (Arabic, Farsi, and English).

Rev. Shehab has earned an MA in the History of the Arabs and Ph.D. studies in Islamic History. He has worked as a journalist at two Lebanese newspapers and adjunct professor at AUB.

Rev. Shehab will be the special guest of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in rural Manito, IL on **August 25**, **2019**. He will conduct a special Sunday School hour and preach at the church service. He will answer questions about the Middle East, Political Islam, and Terrorism at a potluck after the service. Then He will make a special community-wide presentation that afternoon. St. Paul's invites all members of the community to take advantage of this special opportunity.
