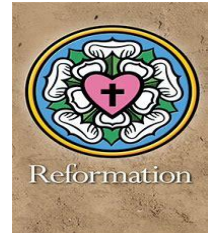

To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Each year, as we approach the festivities surrounding the Eve of All Saints' Day on October 31, I hope in vain that this will be the year that more attention will be focused on the posting of the 95 Theses and less attention will be focused on zombies and candy. That is the crusty old Lutheran preacher in me talking. Perhaps we can encourage our children to dress as Reformation era characters. How wonderful it would be to see little Martin Luther's going door to door "knocking" on the door with copies of the 95 Theses. I do not encourage the use of actual nails

The reality is that our culture outside of the church gets far more time to "teach" than I do. This is where parents, grandparents, godparents, etc. need to step up to the plate and teach. This goes beyond the obvious of making sure that the children know that coming to worship with the people of God is important and it is what God's children do.

In Deuteronomy, God instructed the Israelites and said, "⁴Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ⁵You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. ⁶And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. ⁷You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. ⁸You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. ⁹You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" [Deut. 6:4-9].

Basically, there is never a bad time to share your knowledge of God. If you say, "but I don't know what to teach them," then, a great place to start is Luther's Small Catechism. God has always intended for His Word to be constantly before the eyes of His people. Take a hard look at what is constantly before the eyes of your children and grandchildren. What are they "learning"? Jesus says, "The eye is the lamp of the body . . . If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!" [Mt. 6:22-23]. Christ is the Light of the world. The rest is all darkness.

On October 31, our world will ignore the beauty of why we celebrate All Saints' Day and many will choose to celebrate darkness. I don't expect to see hordes of Martin and Katie Luther's trick-or-treating through the neighborhood. However, remind your children of what is important. The prophet Isaiah said, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined" [Is. 9:2].
