To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Entering into the Advent and Christmas seasons, we are reminded of who we are. We are God's children who are blessed to have received our adoption into His family. We celebrate the birth of Christ who has saved us through His death and resurrection. We wait for Him to return once again and we express a willingness to sacrifice of ourselves for the sake of Christ and His church. This is the focal point of our existence and everything else is outside noise. The world around us has created much "noise" which can be a distraction. It is my prayer that during these weeks filled with many celebrations and temptations for excess (the opposite of sacrifice), we would be able to filter out the noise and hear the clear voice which God intends.

It seems confusing that we celebrate His coming with watchful anticipation for His second coming, but our reason for doing this becomes clear when we understand that the Advent and Christmas seasons are distinct and separate seasons. Please join us throughout these seasons.

Whether we are watching for Him to come or celebrating that He has come, I pray these weeks ahead are filled with the clear voice of God's witness that the Messiah promised to Adam and Eve and to all of their children is the Christ-child born of Mary. Please join us as we celebrate this "good news of a great joy" with watchful anticipation for Him coming once again. Everything else is outside noise.

Concordia Food Banks, Comfort Dogs, Lutheran Prison Ministries, Orphan Grain Train, Camp Callahan, ORLC Youth Group, ORLC St. James School Endowment Fund, and Advocacy Network. 2019-2020 LWML CID Mission Grants

Grant #5 – Internships for Concordia University Chicago Churchwork Students - \$17,000

This grant will allow the CID to make available to DCE and Deaconess Students non-credit internships during the summer between their junior and senior year to develop and practice "real world" evangelism skills, augmenting their training and experience in this important part of church life. The funds would be used for a small stipend, transportation costs, and meals for the participants.
