To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Changing over to a new year is a strange, yet familiar event. Each year, we struggle the first few times we sign our name and write out the date. Changing over to a new year immediately declares the past year to be "old". A few days ago, 2019 did not seem "old". What happened? How did the movement of a clock or the dropping of a ball in Times Square change our view of something as significant as a decade? It hit me when I realized that I am entering into my seventh decade.

Time is such an interesting part of our existence. It is something intangible. You have a past. You live in something called the present. And you look forward into an unknowable future.

Our past is unchangeable. Whatever has happened, has happened. Yet, our memories do change. As we put more and more time between the past and the present, our opinion of the past tends to wax nostalgic. We remember "the good ole days." I believe this phenomenon is partly due to the reality of forgiveness. We tend to look back at people we have known, especially our loved ones, and we "forget" about the faults and failures. This doesn't mean we have a loss of memory, but we tend to look past the failures and remember the good. Listen to how people speak of the deceased at a funeral. Difficult and challenging times become humorous stories later in life. (Please realize that I am speaking in broad generalizations and I am well aware that some events of life will never be viewed as good or humorous.)

Just as we look with increasing fondness upon the past, we tend to look with hope for the future. This is why we welcome and celebrate the coming of the New Year. Everyone looks to the New Year as a chance to start over. Why do we all desire to make resolutions and start over? Perhaps it is because we recognize that the present or immediate past won't be thought of as the "good ole days" for quite some time.

We want our years to be like our days as described by Luther in regard to Baptism: "The Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

Under the grace of your Baptism, each day you arise as a "new man" – that is, you are forgiven, pure, innocent, and righteous in the eyes of God. You are reborn as His child. Yesterday is a memory where all the faults and failures are forgotten. Today is a new day with a great hope for the future.

That is a wonderful approach to welcoming in this New Year. It will not become a reality by adhering to the demands of unrealistic resolutions. The Law only brings temporary change. We always figure out ways to break our resolutions.

Forgiveness for the past and hope for the future is a reality that only God brings. Throughout this year, every day remember your Baptism as you "emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

Grant #5 – Internships for Concordia University Chicago Churchwork Students - \$17,000

This grant will allow the CID to make available to DCE and Deaconess Students non-credit internships during the summer between their junior and senior year to develop and practice "real world" evangelism skills, augmenting their training and experience in this important part of church life. March for Life, Chicago, January 11, 2020 - The largest pro-life event in the Midwest. Join thousands of pro-lifers in speaking out for life. Right to Life of Adams County is organizing a 1-day trip to the March for Life Chicago via Amtrak. The day will include leaving at 6:12 a.m. on January 11, 2020, arriving at Union Station at about 10:40 a.m., walking about .8 mile to Daley Plaza, (stopping for lunch on the way), attending the Rally from 1:00-1:45, and walking in the March from 1:45-3:00 back to Convention Headquarters at the Congress Plaza Hotel. There should be time to attend the convention exhibits for about an hour before walking back to Union Station and taking the 5:58 p.m. train back to Quincy. Arrival in Quincy is at about 10:20 p.m. Participants will need to be able to walk about 3-4 miles (total from and to the train and in the March). 
