To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Our nation and the world have been dealing with virus COVID-19 which has become a worldwide threat. Although it seems to be not particularly deadly to most people, it is very deadly to certain groups such as the elderly and those with certain health conditions. For young healthy people, especially sports fans, there has been a great deal of inconvenience.

There is a word for willingly being inconvenienced: sacrifice. Sacrifice is the willingness to give something of value today so as to have a better tomorrow. To sacrifice is to forgo today's pleasure for tomorrow's advantage. This applies to both secular and religious aspects of life. We don't immediately go out and spend our entire paycheck. We sacrifice potential joy today for a better and more secure future. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to offer sacrifices (which were a foreshadowing of Christ's sacrifice to come) and God forgave them their sin. They sacrificed the firstborn of their flock or something else of great value so that they would have a secure future.

With Holy Week and Easter on the horizon, we are reminded of what real sacrifice looks like. Jesus came to be the ultimate sacrifice so that we could have a much better future with Him for all eternity. His sacrifice was of great cost to Him and no cost to us, other than now the cost of discipleship. Not to compare any of us with Jesus, but we are often called upon to make sacrifices knowing we will see no tangible benefit for ourselves.

Many people who contract COVID-19 are barely bothered by it. Many will never know they had it. Yet, we inconvenience ourselves, we sacrifice for the sake of our neighbors. We do this in our everyday life all the time so that tomorrow will be better. It has been described as a bargain with the future. We don't drive as fast as we possibly can, even though it would be nice to get to where we want to be in a shorter time. Obeying authorities and not doing things which endanger our neighbors are sacrifices we make every day. Most everyone in the world has been inconvenienced in some way due to this virus. I greatly appreciate all of the sacrifices which have been made by our family at Our Redeemer for the sake of keeping others safe.

I pray the death toll in our nation and around the world stays low compared to other pandemics. I pray we are soon able to return to our normal schedules. However, when life as we knew it resumes, I pray that we will do so with a greater appreciation of the value of sacrificing for the sake of others.

CID Endowment Fund started by investing in CID Church Extension Fund CDs. Approximately five years ago the board started to explore options due to declining interest rates on the CDs held for investment. One of the options was Lutheran Legacy Foundation which offered more diversity of investment and matching funds for a portion of the amount invested there. The board has two investments with Lutheran Legacy Foundation which achieves some diversity of investment. In 2016 the board developed and adopted an Investment Policy Statement to guide further diversification of its investments. In August 2016 the board elected to convert about half of its CDs to a managed equity portfolio at the Illinois National Bank. Today, the investments held by the Endowment Fund consist of Church Extension Fund CDs, Lutheran Legacy Foundation and assets managed by the Illinois National Bank. The assets of the CID Endowment Fund totaled \$881,858 at the end of 2011. Seven years later, at the end of 2018, the assets totaled \$1,175,224. Next month's Endowment Fund paragraphs will discuss historical and current approaches to funding CID scholarships.

One group particularly hard hit are new Americans; those immigrant and refugee families that are learning the ways of our country, the language and the nuances of being an American. Most of them have entry level jobs and several have been laid off or had had their hours significantly reduced. Additionally, many have been relying on the school system to feed their children breakfast and lunch and are now trying to keep up with rising food bills. Our partners in ministry, Christian Friends of New Americans, are reaching out to these distressed families through congregations to provide much needed help and assistance. And they need our help. Recently through the generosity of some donors, CFNA is matching your financial gifts dollar for dollar up to \$10,000. CID Endowment Fund CID scholarship funding for the 2019-20 academic year was the first year CID knew in advance what would be received from the Endowment Fund. The CID received in excess of \$44,000 to fund scholarships. The Endowment Fund Board of Trustees has indicated to the CID the continued proactive funding for each academic year equal to 4% of fund assets at the end of each calendar year. The amount will be determined at the February board meeting, with the amount communicated to the CID at that time for their planning purposes. In 2019 the board provided one half of the funds in July and half in November to coordinate with CID's disbursements of funds for students.


