To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Back in March when we began our "15 days to flatten the curve" I began broadcasting Bible class on Facebook Live. Preparing for and presenting that material has made, for me, all of this COVID chaos not only bearable but something for which I am thankful. I have been a big fan of Martin Luther for a long time, as you know from the excerpts of Luther's Works included in each week's bulletin. However, studying Luther's Small and Large Catechism in the way we have these past six months has forced/allowed me to dig deeper into Luther's mind than I ever did before.

As we prepare to celebrate Reformation Day this month, I am looking at the events surrounding those early days of the rediscovery of the Gospel as if I have new eyes. Don't get me wrong, it is not as if my theological understanding of the Gospel has changed. I believed and cherished my salvation by grace through faith apart from works before the year 2020. However, Luther's depth of understanding in how our suffering ties us to the suffering of Jesus is simply profound. Again, I knew this on an academic level since my days at Seminary. Yet I had not understood it in the way that I do today.

The year of our Lord 2020 will go down in infamy. There are those who argue that this is possibly the worst year in recent history. As a student of history, I would say that such an argument is born of recency bias (favoring recent events over historic ones). For me, 2020 has been different and cumbersome. However, as many of you have probably heard me say before, "Any day that you learn something new is a good day." Therefore, I struggle to label the year 2020 in a negative light. From a personal growth standpoint, 2020 has been one of my best years. Also, given that a person tends to learn much more from their struggles and mistakes than they do from their successes (especially if those successes come easy), the year of our Lord 2020 is and remains fertile ground for learning and growth, which is always good.
