To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

We will spend the entire month of March in the penitential season of Lent. This is a time of repentance (and, by definition, actual repentance requires actual change). Repentance literally means "to turn around," "to turn away," or "to change your mind." Repentance means seeing yourself different than you did before because the Holy Spirit working through the Word of God has changed you.

Historically, Lent is a time for "giving something up" like chocolate or alcohol or whatever would be something meaningful so that daily attention would be given to God. This would be done as a sign of devotion to God. We discipline our bodies to benefit our souls. There is obviously nothing wrong with giving something up. Luther states in the Small Catechism, "Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training. But that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: 'Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins.'"

However, instead of "giving something up," I encourage you to "add something." Add a morning or evening devotion to your routine. Take two or three minutes to read one of the six chief parts from Luther's Small Catechism. Read a chapter of Scripture (I suggest starting with the Gospels). If you have not made a practice of coming to midweek services, add that to your Lenten preparation. Allow yourself to be in the Word of God. As Luther says, "It is in the Word and nowhere else that God permits Himself to be found."

On a personal note, I would like to thank all of you for the prayers and extra help with supplying the needs of my family during our days of quarantine. Your kindness and generosity was overwhelming and greatly appreciated. We certainly did not feel as if we were going through those days alone. I am so thankful that God called me to be your pastor. The family of Our Redeemer has been a tremendous blessing to the Eden family.



Lutheran students may also enter through a home school or congregation e.g. confirmation class, youth group when validated by a pastor or teacher. Contest Guidelines Students will write a life-affirming essay based on the theme: God Chose You with the bible verse: "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit". (John 15:16)

- 1. Not incorporating the theme and verse in the essay will disqualify the entry.
- 2. Examples of topics the essay could deal with are, but not limited to: abortion, the handicapped, adoption or foster care, infanticide, cloning, stem cell research, physician assisted suicide or euthanasia etc.
- 3. Essays should include student's name, grade (Identify school or church) and email address. All entries submitted by a teacher or pastor, should include their name and email address. This information should be submitted on the rubric page used in grading the essay. Teachers are encouraged to consult the rubric (see Gretchen) and submit qualified entries.
- 4. All sources for references, statistics and quotes should be incorporated within the essay and then included in a bibliography at the end. Grades 6 8 should submit essays up to 400 words Grades 9 12 should submit essays up to 750 words.

If you've received a COVID-19 vaccine, you'll need to provide the manufacturer name when you come to donate. Upon vaccination, you should receive a card or printout indicating what COVID-19 vaccine was received, and we encourage you to bring that card with you to your next donation. In most cases, there is no deferral time for individuals who received a COVID-19 vaccine as long as they are symptom free and feeling well at the time of donation. The following eligibility guidelines apply to each COVID-19 vaccine received, including boosters: -There is no deferral time for eligible blood donors who are vaccinated with an inactivated or RNA based COVID-19 vaccine manufactured by AstraZeneca, Janssen/J&J, Moderna, Novavax, or Pfizer, -Eligible blood donors who received a live attenuated COVID-19 vaccine or do not know what type of COVID-19 vaccine they received must wait two weeks before giving blood. -If you have an appointment scheduled and need to change your donation date based on the above guidance, click here. -If you have further eligibility questions, please call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767). Please note: The Red Cross, as an organization, is not a healthcare provider and is not administering COVID-19 vaccinations in the U.S. However, Red Cross volunteers who are medical professionals may work with local authorities to help give vaccinations if their state licenses permit them to do so. In addition, Red Cross teams are currently helping to vaccinate U.S. service members on bases around the world.
