To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

As you know, we had designated the week following Sunday, June 6 as Servant Week. I want to thank all who organized and participated with our work projects and the tremendous outpouring of donations to Care Net. The overearching theme of the week was Paul's words from Philippians 2:3, "in humility count others more significant than yourselves." She is being taught that making that extra effort is fundamental to the job and will make her nursing experience better. When the needs of others are considered more significant than your needs, it makes life better for everyone. It is also pleasing to God.

The value of Servant Week was found in what it did for those who put forth the time and effort to serve much more than in the number of weeds pulled from a playground or bags of food prepared to be given to those in need or vehicles washed so that the residents of the Veteran's Home have clean vehicles in which to ride. Perhaps the best part of Servant Week and the most fulfilling aspect was the joy to work alongside fellow members of the church and interact with others in our community. It was made very clear to us that the work which was done was greatly appreciated. If you were unable to volunteer this year, I encourage you to come and join us when we have Servant Week next year. I pray that we all keep our eyes open for opportunities to serve and to count others more significant that ourselves.

We will announce a date in a couple weeks when you can start delivering items to the church. Thanks to everyone who have helped us raise over \$13,000 in the last six years. All of this for missions! Thanks again. Let's keep up the Lord's work!!

Request for Suggestions from the Congregation ORLC has received a federal payroll tax refund of \$8,926.15 due to a law passed last March as a result of the Covid crisis. The Church Council is considering what to do with this unexpected income, and would like to hear ideas from the Congregation before making a recommendation to the Voters Assembly at the September 26 Voters Meeting. Among the ideas being considered so far are:

Just keep the money in the general fund for future needs; Pay it into the ORLC St. James School Endowment Fund; Donate it to selected mission project or charity such as the St. John's Food Pantry, the Quincy Neighborhood Federation, or similar entity; Provide additional assistance to the church in Uganda, or others in need; Divide the total amount and allocate it to two or more of such entities.

If you have an idea for good use of the funds, please communicate it to a member of the Church Council before its next meeting on August 18. At that meeting the Council will consider the issue and what to recommend to the Voters on September 26, at which time the Voters will make the final decision. Thank you.
