To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I am very thankful that COVID is much less disruptive to the world than it was a year ago, and I pray the disruptions keep growing smaller in our rearview mirror. I am thankful that we have progressed as far as we have and that many things have returned to normal. As Fall arrived, I have been reminded that certain things are still disrupted. The COVID lockdown in Uganda caused Rev. Peter Maganda to have to postpone his journey to St. Louis where he was to attend a pastor's conference and continuing education seminar. I was looking forward to spending time with him and seeing our world through his eyes. It will have to wait.

Oddly enough, thinking about him made me think of Eratosthenes, the Greek scientist/mathematician living in Egypt around 240 BC. He is credited as being the first to scientifically prove what Aristotle had theorized over 100 years earlier – that the world was round. He proved it by measuring shadows cast by obelisks (tall stone monuments) on the summer and winter solstice in Alexandria and Syene (modern day Aswan) which is about 570 miles south of Alexandria. His journey back and forth would have taken him 3-4 weeks to sail up and down the Nile River. His final calculation for the circumference of the earth was short by less than 500 miles. The science understood by the ancients is quite impressive. When Christopher Columbus argued for a western route to India, he was about 9000 miles short on his estimate concerning the circumference of the earth. He should have listened to Eratosthenes like the panel of experts did who argued against Columbus' proposal and originally convinced King Ferdinand to turn down funding Columbus' journey. Every educated European knew that the earth was round. When you see quotes concerning Columbus or Magellan or Galileo on the internet stating that the church or representatives of the church thought that the earth was flat, those are all fabrications from haters of the church from the 1800's such as Robert Ingersoll or Washington Irving.

My mind wandered off in this direction thinking about these things because I am dreading our annual plunge into evening darkness with the loss of Daylight Savings Time and our journey toward the shortest day of the year at the Winter solstice. I thought of Rev. Maganda because he lives about 30 miles from the equator near Lake Victoria, which is the headwaters for the Nile River. All of his life, he has lived with 12 hours of sunshine every day (+/- about 10 minutes). The days are not noticeably longer in the summer nor shorter in the winter in Magamaga, Uganda.

As you can tell, I do have a mind that wanders around. Ever since Rev. Maganda told me that he would be coming to America, I find myself looking at the events of my life that seem common and imagining that he will see our lives as anything but mundane or ordinary. As we make plans for celebrating Thanksgiving, I encourage you to give thanks to God for the things which are easily taken for granted. Eratosthenes changed the understanding of the world because he didn't take the movement of shadows for granted. Dealing with COVID has taught us that very often the best days are days that simply feel normal, mundane, and ordinary. Give thanks to God for all the ordinary things which we easily take for granted.

Graduation / Cameroon





In August, Nathan graduated and earned his stripes to become Captain Federwitz, like his father. He is



Years ago, a famous evangelist made an odd decision. He determined, for once, not to say anything to anyone about Jesus on a stagecoach trip he was taking. Things turned out terribly, he recalled. He had no cross to bear or take up, and soon he went to sleep.

Jesus said: "Be alert, since you don't know when the master of the house is coming . . . Otherwise, when he comes suddenly he might find you sleeping. And what I say to you, I say to everyone: be alert!" (Mark 13:35-37).

Speaking the Gospel serves as a constant reminder of the eternal life-and-death import of faith or unbelief. This is not only for other people, but also for ourselves.

When we tell someone else the Good News about Jesus, we also have the opportunity to "eavesdrop" on it, hearing it all over again for our own life in the Lord. If we encounter pushback from others, we finally have nowhere to turn except to the returning Christ. In all these ways, we act as wide-awake, alert, and forgiven disciples of the crucified but now exalted and returning Jesus.
