To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

As we enter into the Advent and Christmas seasons, I initially was thinking that working on preparing for many hours of presentation during this busy time of year would take away from my work at Our Redeemer as I strive to lead our focus on Christ and the Incarnation (Jesus coming in the flesh) which is the heart of what we celebrate this time of year. On the contrary, the focus of the subject matter for this conference has forced my attention even more directly to the Incarnation of our Lord and our very personal connection to the flesh and blood of the Son of God.

It is easy to get distracted this time of year as we fill our schedule with many and various events and opportunities for fellowship and celebration. I encourage you to find distractions and opportunities which keep your eyes on the flesh and blood of the Son of God. Every year, we hear the plea for the people of God to "Put Christ back into Christmas," and that is always good advice. However, as the focus of the season in on the Incarnation of the Son of God, it is also good advice to say, "Put the Mass back into Christmas."
