To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

As Lent draws to a close and we enter Holy Week and then finally the Easter season, we eagerly anticipate gathering together in the joy and hope of the resurrection. These past couple of years have been difficult and disjointed. Worshiping via the Internet has been an avenue which allowed us to stay somewhat in contact through our time of social distancing. For our homebound members and those who do not live in the Quincy area, and yet desire to join in our worship, tuning in on Facebook or YouTube, has been a real blessing.

However, for those who are healthy and able to attend in person, choosing to stay at home and watch because it is convenient is not the same as gathering with the people of God around His Word and Sacrament. Jesus says, "Do this in remembrance of Me." If anyone is unable to attend because they are homebound, please contact the church so that **in-home communion visits** fill that void. If anyone is not homebound but still does not feel comfortable in large crowds, continue to watch from home and then join us at Our Redeemer on **Wednesdays** at **11:30 AM** for our **midweek communion service**. Refraining from the Sacrament is not a spiritually healthy option. Jesus says, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. Whoever feeds on My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For My flesh is true food, and My blood is true drink. Whoever feeds on My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me, and I in him" [John 6:53-56].

In addition to missing out on the Sacrament, as the church, there is so much more in being part of the body of Christ and as the community of believers than just tuning in to listen to a sermon. You cannot be a source of comfort to others, or receive the comfort of others, or be of service to others without gathering with other people. You cannot teach your children what it means to be part of a community through a computer screen. We lament on how our youth do not learn to engage in real communities because so much of their engagement is through social media. Our children will never know what it means to be members of the body of Christ if they are separated from the rest of the body.

Now that COVID restrictions are thankfully over and life is returning to normal, even though COVID will most likely remain in the background for the rest of our lives, it is time to return to the Lord and His Church. As we celebrate Easter and the new life for us guaranteed through His resurrection, we recognize Easter as a time when He makes all things new. It is time for a new start and to once again gather and work together as the people of God in the House of God.




