To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

June is a special month in the life of the Lutheran Church as it was on June 25, 1530 that the Augsburg Confession was first presented as a statement of faith which we confess as being a correct exposition of the Word of God, and it has never been shown to be contrary to the Word. That should give all of us great confidence that what we believe, teach, and confess is faithful. It has stood the test of time.

As we lead up to the 500th anniversary of that event, there are other milestones worthy of mentioning which occurred. Martin Luther published the New Testament in German 500 years ago, in the year 1522. Amazingly, he translated it in its entirety in only 10 weeks while he was in hiding in Wartburg Castle, as he had been declared an outlaw.

Of all the events of Luther's life, this is the most profound and important, and I would argue that this was the most profound event in the history of the Medieval church. Luther did not have the opportunity to read Scripture until he went to study for his doctorate in theology, even though he had been ordained as a priest several years earlier. Now, ordinary Christians could read the words of Christ in their own language.

Luther's translation inspired William Tyndale, who was ordained in 1521 and was considered an outlaw in England for desiring to translate the Bible into English. In 1525, Tyndale joined Luther at Wittenberg and did his translating work in the safety of Prince Frederick's jurisdiction. In 1526, Tyndale's Bible was printed in Germany and smuggled into England. His English translation was heavily influenced by Luther's German Bible. Tyndale was arrested in Antwerp, Belgium and burned at the stake in 1536. It was a dangerous time.

In 1607, King James authorized an official English Bible which was printed in 1611. The 47 translators were instructed not to use Tyndale's translation as influence. They ignored that instruction and modern scholars note that most of the KJV is identical to or at least heavily influenced by Tyndale because they saw no reason to "reinvent the wheel." As a Lutheran, I like to point out that Tyndale's English was particularly close to Luther's German translation, and Tyndale's translation was considered so good and accurate that it became the basis for the KJV – even though the King had instructed them to the contrary. So I will point out once again that Luther completed his New Testament in 10 weeks. Luther's genius is unmatched. In my humble opinion, his only competition is St. Augustine.

I am excited that through the coming years, we will have many more significant events in the life of Luther which we will celebrate as a 500th anniversary. However, none will be more impactful than the Word of God coming into the language of the people.




