To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Perhaps the best part of Servant Week and the most fulfilling aspect was the joy to work alongside fellow members of the church and interact with others in our community. It was made very clear to us that the work which was done was greatly appreciated. If you were unable to volunteer this year, I encourage you to come and join us when we have Servant Week next year. I pray that we all keep our eyes open for opportunities to serve and to count others more significant that ourselves.


