# To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I am shocked at how quickly summer is drawing to a close. I had given myself a number of tasks to accomplish during these days when I do not have the responsibilities which come with the school year. I have accomplished very little of what I intended. This is not to say that I had a guiet or unproductive summer. It is just that I had plans and God had plans. This is why the Lord taught us to pray, "Thy will be done."

The main task which I had given myself was to complete a large section of the material for my Wednesday Bible class which focuses on the six chief parts of Christian doctrine from Luther's catechisms. The last of the Zone rallies will be September 22. On September 23, I will be going to St. Louis to a conference which will be attended by Rev. Peter Maganda. I will be bringing him with me to Quincy so that he can visit several days before leaving for Pittsburg, PA. He will be preaching here at Our Redeemer September 24 and 25. We will be sharing details concerning his visit as they are available.

Because of my September schedule, I will not be able to begin Confirmation class until September 28. That is exceptionally late, which means that I need to get information to the parents now in August so that they can work with their children on memory work and whatever else I need of them so that we can hit the ground running once my schedule allows me to hold class.

I pray you have had a blessed and productive summer. I am very excited about the next couple of months. I am thankful that the Lord has given me a multitude of opportunities to serve within His Kingdom – even if those other opportunities keep me from doing the stuff that I originally planned on doing.




