## To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I find the field of archaeology to be fascinating. The work that has been done in Israel and the surrounding region has repeatedly pointed to the Old and New Testament texts as being historically accurate. Again and again, ancient cities have been found, documents have been uncovered which support the biblical text, and the story of God's interaction with His people is heard. I am reminded what happened on Palm Sunday when the Pharisees told Jesus to rebuke His disciples as they and the crowd were praising God and saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" 'Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!' [Luke 19:38]. Jesus replied, "I tell you, if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out" [Luke 19:40]. As the field of archaeology uncovers more of the past, the stones are crying out and attesting to the truth of God and His Word.

One very interesting discovery is the ancient Hebrew use of the mark of the cross in the days before Christ, and even before Roman domination – which made the cross the common tool of capital punishment. The biblical scrolls discovered around the Dead Sea had numerous passages which refer to the coming of Christ marked with a "+" or an "X". These scrolls were hidden away well before Jesus began His public ministry.

Among the Old Testament people, the cross was a sign of protection and deliverance. As Greek became the common language of the world, some Jews turned the cross on its side as an "X" because the Greek word for Messiah, "Christ", begins with the Greek letter "X" or "chi" (pronounced like the first two letters of "kite").

Ancient Jewish homes of the B.C. era have been uncovered with crosses carved into or painted on the stones in and around the dwelling. The Jewish Christians easily brought these practices into the Church. Living under the protection of the cross now took on a whole new meaning. Wearing the image of the cross in jewelry or bearing the mark of the cross in other ways (some marked their forehead with the sign) was a means of publicly identifying yourself as one belonging to the Lord and that you were marked for salvation.

In Baptism, we do this. As the pastor, I make the sign of the cross both upon the forehead and upon the heart to mark the child as one redeemed by Christ the crucified. In Baptism, we become the people of the cross as our old self is crucified with Christ [Romans 6:6]. We carry those marks of the cross all of our days upon the earth, and we live under the protection and with the deliverance Christ's cross brings.
