To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Holy Week is here, and we will continue our most joyful celebration of the resurrection of Christ our Lord well into the month of May. If we only listen to the world outside of Christ's church, it would be easy to forget that Easter is a seven-week celebration that leads wonderfully into the Day of Pentecost and the Sunday of the Holy Trinity. This nine-week stretch is the center of our ongoing celebration throughout the Church Year. It far surpasses the 12 days of Christmas leading up to Epiphany – and with good reason. If it were not for Christ's death and resurrection, there would have been no "good news of great joy" for the shepherds to hear.

Currently, all the stores are decorated for Easter. With Easter Day being the first Sunday of April, the world outside of the church will take down the decorations and try to forget about Easter by that Monday afternoon. Understanding the calendar, especially of the Church Year, does help us in putting holidays in their proper perspective.

In the minds of so many people, both inside and outside of the church, Christmas has far surpassed Easter in importance – our society greets one another saying "Merry Christmas" from the day after Thanksgiving until Christmas Day, and then quits celebrating Christmas during the actual Christmas season. For many people, Thanksgiving and the Eve of All Saints Day (better known as Halloween) attract much more attention than Easter. It is unfortunate that the resurrection of our Lord is viewed with such indifference by so many in our world today. Even when Easter is celebrated, chocolate bunnies and Easter egg hunts seem to dominate the headlines. This is a season, not just a day, to celebrate that God sent His Son to rescue us from sin and death. I pity the world that does not share in our joy of the Gospel. Every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection of our Lord, but this time of year is extra special as we greet one another each week and each day with the words: "Christ is Risen!! He is Risen indeed!! Alleluia!!

Grant #8, Textbooks for Concordia Preparatory School in Ghana - \$5,650

This school has grown to over 1,000 students, many with a Muslin background. Recent requirements for the curriculum by the government make necessary new textbooks in all areas of education. It is a great struggle to finance these books with the current result being the sharing of one book by 4 or 5 students.

Our CID mission goal is \$105,000, of which \$78,750 is for our grants and the remainder for our national mission grants.



Greetings Brother, Rev. Martin Eden,

I hope you are doing well, and the Lenten season has kicked off well with you.

We are so much grateful for the support towards the construction of the First Secondary Lutheran School at Magamaga in Mayuge District. This school is strategically located to serve about 2000 students every year. These will come from Magamaga and the 16 surrounding villages. And because it is planned to be a day and boarding school, we are to serve even children of other communities where we have congregations. These will want their children to study from a church founded school.

Many Christian Lutherans, Anglicans and Roman Catholics, and Muslim parents are eagerly waiting for the time when the school will start to operate, and they bring their children. And my prayer too is that the first classroom block gets and we start on the Administration block this year.

The Level at which we are:

Currently the three-classroom block is at the wind level. The \$13,000 fund is all used up. I still know that the funds were designated for buying of windows, doors, and roofing, but we needed to start that level. And once we get another funding, the \$13,000 will be designated for that purpose. It was the only money we had on the project account and we needed to start before reaching the levels that require doors, windows and roofing.

We finally got the Bill of Quantities. On our architectural designs we have the following structures billed.

1. 1st block with three classrooms, costing 202,920,867/= (\$56,366.9075)
 2. Science laboratory block, costing 202,920,867/= (\$56,366.9075)
 3. Dormitory 1 for Girls, costing 202,920,867/= (\$56,366.9075)
 4. 2nd Block with Three Classrooms, costing 202,920,867/= (\$56,366.9075)

5. Five VIP Latrines, all to cost **144,000,000** (\$40,000)

6. Administrative block (having the Staff room, Headteacher's Office, 1st Deputy Headteacher's office, 2nd Deputy headteacher's office, Pastors/Chaplain's Office), costing **202,920,867/=**

(\$56,366.9075)

Between now and 2025, we are prioritizing the six structures above. Currently we are working on the 1st block with three classrooms. Our plan is to complete it by August once funds are realized and start on the science Laboratory, the Administration block, Dormitory 1 for Girls, and latrines. This work is to be done now and next year. And the 2025 we will work on the 2nd Block with Three Classrooms.

The above structures shall cost us Uganda shillings **1,158,604,335/=** an equivalence of **\$321,835 minus the \$13,000 already sent, we will need 1,111,806,000/= (\$308,835)**

The other structures below shall be worked upon later after 2025 and these are;

- 7. 4th Block with three classrooms,
- 8. 5th Block with three classrooms
- 9. 3rd Block with three classrooms
- 10. Dormitory 1 for boys,
- 11. Dormitory 2 for girls
- 12. Dormitory 2 for boys
- 13. Computer Laboratory and library block
- 14. The Headteacher's House,
- 15. The Kitchen house,
- 16. 1st staff quarter blocks,
- 17. 2nd Staff quarter block,
