I know that two years seems like a long time to prepare for a 10-day trip, but my experience is that extra preparation and organization makes for a better experience for everyone

NOTICE OF SPECIAL VOTERS ASSEMBLY MEETING on June 4, 2023, at 10:15 am

The Church Council has called for a special Voters Assembly meeting in the Sanctuary immediately following the Sunday morning service on June 4, to consider the following questions:

- 1. Should the Congregation transfer \$270,000 from Assets line item 121, the Bequest Fund checking account, to invest in three \$90,000 certificates of deposit, laddered in six-month terms, so as to take advantage of much higher current interest rates? (This would leave over \$43,000 in that account if needed for the purpose of the Bequest Fund, to make purchases for or improvements to the church. but still have additional monies available for that purpose if needed, within a relatively short term without early withdrawal penalty.)
- 2. Should the Congregation secure a church credit card with a \$1,000 limit for use by the Pastor and Office Administrator so that they do not have to advance their own funds, and then seek reimbursement, for office supplies, postage, petty cash, necessary travel expenses, or other routine expenditures?



Message re Church Expenditures and Financial Information

Dear Fellow Members of Our Redeemer,

Our Congregation has been blessed by God with healthy financial stability due to our generous donors and efforts to be fiscally responsible. We members of the Church Council and Board of Elders strive to be totally transparent with all members of the Congregation about the Church's financial dealings. We want you to know about how we try to be good stewards handling the funds you generously provide, and encourage you to inquire and voice your opinions about how we do it. You can do that at the Voters' meetings or directly to members of the Council and Elders, and also by electing new representatives at the annual business meeting in September if you are not happy with how finances are being handled.

The Bylaws provide that the elected Church Council may approve expenditures up to \$1,000, which must then be reported at the next Voters' meeting. All expenditures over \$1,000 must be approved by the Voters Assembly at one of the four regular Voters' meetings per year, or at special meetings called to address pressing issues.

The church budget has a line item for benevolence to assist members in dire need. So that no one person makes decisions on how benevolence money is spent, to screen applications for assistance, and to prevent possible abuse of our generosity, the Elders have adopted a new written policy regarding payment of church funds for this purpose:

The policy and procedure for expenditures pursuant to the Elders' Budget line item 321, Benevolence, shall be as follows:

i. A subcommittee consisting of the Pastor, one Elder, and the President of the Congregation is established to review and make benevolence expenditures for the benefit of members of the Congregation.

ii. Such expenditures shall be made according to the following guidelines:

- 1. One payment of no more than \$100 per month shall be made per household;
- 2. Such payments shall not exceed \$200 per calendar quarter per household;
- 3. At least two-thirds of the subcommittee members must approve such payments;
- 4. If additional payments are needed, approval by the Elders and the Church Council is required, and such additional payments shall not exceed \$500 per calendar quarter and \$1000 per calendar year;
- 5. Prior to authorization of such payments, inquiry shall be made to the household as to whether they have sought other available resources, and if not, a list of other resources or contacts for additional help should be provided to the household;
- 6. Upon approval of any such payments, the Treasurer should be notified by the subcommittee, and such payments may then be made at the middle and/or the end of each month;
- 7. Payments shall be marked on the Treasurer's check registry without the household's name;
- 8. Such payments should be made to the service or resource provider and not directly to the household;
- 9. Cash payments may be made, depending on the circumstances;
- 10. The subcommittee shall report payment authorizations to the Elders;
- 11. When considering payment requests, if the Pastor is unavailable, an Elder shall be substituted. If the President is unavailable, the Vice President shall be substituted. If the household is related to, or contains a close personal friend of, a member of the subcommittee, an Elder not so related to the household shall similarly be substituted before the issue is decided. Questions of conflict of interest shall be resolved by the Board of Elders.

All income, expenditures and accounts are fully listed in the financial reports regularly provided to the Council and the Voters Assembly. The only exceptions are the names of offerings donors to the Church and the amounts given by them, the names of other donors who ask to remain anonymous, and the names of recipients of benevolence funds paid according to the Elders' policy. However, the total amounts of donations and monies given in benevolence are reported.

Because the reports are detailed, and because we don't see any need for folks outside our church to know our business or have knowledge that might enable them to seek access to our funds, we ask that you use due care and caution with how you handle the written financial reports. You are free to take them home with you after Council or Voters' meetings, for thoughtful review and/or to keep them indefinitely, but thereafter we ask that you handle them carefully with an eye to protecting the Church from anyone who might seek to take advantage. Please keep the reports safely at home, shred or otherwise destroy them. We urge you not to just put them in some other recycle container or leave them otherwise exposed to persons who might seek to do harm to our Church.
